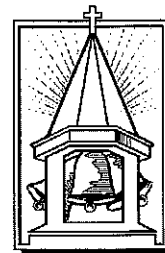

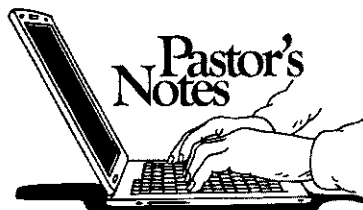

Greetings,

The past few weeks I have been reflecting on John 13:34, "Love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another." What Jesus is speaking of is a true and deep love, what is known as agape love. Agape love is very deep rooted love, agape love means we will love people no matter how they treat us, no matter how badly they have wronged us, no matter how badly they have injured us. We love them; we don't let bitterness or resentment enter our heart.

I recently read an article about love that put forth the question is love a noun or a verb? It can be both. Love as a noun means that we are wondering what someone is going to do for us, feels despair when we no longer feel "in love", demands its own way, finds faults in others, expect others to serve us.

But love as a verb wonders what we are going to do for others, understands the ebb and flow of feelings, focuses more on expressing love than feeling love, works to understand differences and is open to new ways of doing things, gives grace and forgiveness, and love as a verb serves freely.

In 1 Corinthians chapter 13 it says; *"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails."*

This is love as a verb. This is the love that is talked about throughout the New Testament. The most interesting thing, however, is a less often quoted part of the verse that says, *"When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me."* So love has to grow up. It has to mature. We need to allow our love to mature into the agape love of Christ. We have to allow love to become a verb and not a noun.

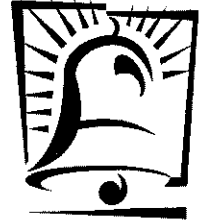

EARTHQUAKE IN NEPAL

An extremely powerful earthquake struck Nepal on April 25, 2015 causing massive damage to buildings and infrastructure. Tremors were felt across northern India and neighboring Bangladesh and Pakistan. Thousands have been injured and more than 4,300 people have been killed and that number may continue to rise.

How is LWR Responding?

LWR is committing an initial response of \$500,000. Our staff on the ground are safe and are continuing to assess the situation.

LWR is immediately shipping:

- 9,240 Quilts and 1,000 Personal Care Kits
- 100 water filtration units so safe water is available

We are working with local partners and the international relief community to plan our early emergency response and will continue to communicate as our plans take shape. Our initial response will respond to the most immediate needs on the ground and will likely include cash transfer, which helps families purchase other necessary supplies.

CALL to ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Marvin Sager at 7:00 PM.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Parish Life Committee Report

- Serving refreshments after the lent service on March 25, as we have on the other lent services that have been held in Meyersville.
- Church under the Trees will be on April 19. There will be a pot luck lunch following church. All families will be asked to bring a meat dish and a side dish or dessert. The church will provide paper goods and tea. There was discussion to serve the meal under the trees. We will wait until closer to date to decide, depending on weather and conditions.
- We are hoping to have a fill the church Sunday in May. We will discuss this in April's meeting.
- There was discussion to move our meetings to directly after church, possibly on the third Sunday of the month. We want to double check on when other teams meet, as we do not want our meeting to conflict with anyone else's. We will set our April meeting after checking dates with other teams.

- Movies in the basement: we have a donated TV and DVD player and have shown the movie "Gods not Dead" for the 4th and 5th graders. "Heaven is for Real" has also been suggested.

- Opening location – some would like a separate location for the youth opening. The basement was discussed. This is a long range plan, due to drainage and mold. We decided to table this.
- Glenn Ruschhaupt will get a white board 4' x 8' from Alamo Lumber for the basement for Jackie's class as requested.
- Food on Sundays for the students: How often? Maybe just once a month? Laurie and Heather put out a sign-in sheet. The students really like this. (No volunteers for the last Sunday I was there; Wanda didn't think last Sunday either) Teacher Appreciation Sunday- Laurie volunteered to host and cook for the teachers and spouses maybe this summer.
- SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL - Heather Roeske has a simple curriculum that she used at her previous church. One class, alternating Video, Lesson, and Craft through the summer weeks. She has printed lessons and craft suggestions for summer. LOOKS GOOD! Thanks Heather!

- The asbestos renovation/demolition survey. Sampling was completed on Mar. 5, 2014. Waiting on report.

New Business:

- Maintenance of the organ blower and motor was discussed. Dickie will work with Johnny Jank to determine if our organ specialist could do that at his scheduled maintenance visits as we are not experienced in what is involved in performing this maintenance. If he cannot do this, we will have to look into other options.
- Schedule computer maintenance. Scheduled for Aug.
- The property team authorized our church secretary to obtain needed mailboxes to set up a mailbox system for certain council members. Someone from the property team will help with installation if needed.

Project List:

- Paint crosses and install before Easter. Marv.
- Light fixtures at church entrance. Vance will make functional until remodel of church.
- Meeting with Surface Burial concerning cemetery issues. Dickie and Pastor will meet with Surface Burial to discuss and determine what is expected to maintain our cemetery. Have row markers built. The grave lines were staked and Dickie will schedule a date to meet.
- Revision of cemetery rules. We discussed downloading cemetery rules used by the Catholic Churches as a guide to revising our rules. Dickie will download.
- Parsonage rodent problem. Pastor will build covers out

of hardware cloth to insert into the access holes to prevent animals from entering. Hardware cloth will be installed in the ground to prevent rodent access. –Glenn will assist pastor as needed.

• Cemetery graves needing attention:

Willie Mae and Erwin Brandt. Clay found that Beverly Hartman was a relative of Willie Mae and Erwin Brandt. He found out that the last close heir has died. Dickie will get cost estimate from Surface Burial for repairs to the grave.

Alfred and Bertha Albrecht. Dickie made another contact with Ray Albrecht concerning the graves. Surface Burial will fix the Albrecht graves when they do the work on the Ralph Egg grave. Surface Burial also noted that they will fix the Hartman grave at that time.

- Eagle Scout Project, Dylan Ohrt. Dylan could not meet with us at our last meeting. We look forward to meeting with him at our next meeting.

- Conversion of one of the basement walls to a chalk board wall. GLENN HAS LOCATED 4' X 8' SHEET OF SUITABLE MATERIAL TO ATTACH TO WALL AT ALAMO LUMBER AND WILL PICK UP.

- Name plates for Dan Dentler and Mildred Metting tables and benches and Boyer tree. Language for the name plaques for Dan Dentler and Mildred Metting have been discussed and approved by Gracie Binz. Marv is in the process of getting estimates for the plates.

- Signage to close cemetery at night. Clay had pictures of signage at a Victoria cemetery. Will continue to investigate.

- Inventory of furniture and equipment & report to Church Council. Dickie

- Re-grade area along the garage to provide better drainage. Pastor will attempt with his box blade.

- Propane tank leaning. Dickie will contact Rath Propane to determine if they will do this.

- Winterize plumbing at trees. Dickie.

- Dust Fans. Marv will check to determine if Bonnie can do this.

- Secure dumpster lids. Dickie.

- Dickie will determine if Britton Blain can do the following;

1. Paint/replace the rusty sheets of metal on the garage roof.
2. Repair or replace sills under the stage to prevent future termite damage.
3. Paint dumpster.

- Parsonage windows. Probably Alenco windows.

Workday April 11; Time 8-12. Projects were discussed and prioritized as follows:

OLD STONE CHURCH HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

January 21, 2015

The Old Stone Church Historical Committee met Wednesday, January 21, 2015 at 9 a.m. . President Clifford Haun called the meeting to order and Marvin Sager had the opening prayer. Present were Elizabeth Beard, Clifford Haun, Ruth Peters, Obert & Carol Ann Sagebiel, Marvin & Norrean Sager, Bruce Weise, Pr. John Boor, and new member prospect, Darren Otto.

The November 19th minutes were read by Carol Ann Sagebiel and approved. Elizabeth Beard's treasurer's report showed a November 19th balance of \$29,972.60. Income, which included December's offering and donations in memory of Ralph Egg, was \$6,678.50. After expenses, the January 21, 2015 balance is \$36,576.10. Elizabeth's visitors report was 7 from Texas.

Eight trees, with water lines, were planted on the cemetery by the St. John's property team, plaques are being considered.

Obert Sagebiel made a motion to have new Treasurer, Norrean Sager, and President, Clifford Haun, to be authorized as alternate signers on the Prosperity Bank checking account, and also signers and key holders for the Lock Box, and to have Elizabeth Beard removed from these items. This motion was seconded by Bruce Weise. Motion passed.

The antique rose bush at the cemetery iron fence enclosure needs to be trimmed in February. This rose bush was donated to the OSC at a 1993 cemetery symposium that was held at the OSC. Also, need to spray Roundup around the plants at the front door. After being contacted by Bruce Weise, Texas Historical Commission representative, Quana Childs, from the Architectural Division in Austin met with us to answer questions and give advice on what options we may have on the OSC 20 year old wood shingle roof that has lost some shingles and may need to be replaced. She told us they have only review authority to encourage us to have our new roof look as much like the original as possible, but we are to decide what our financial situation can handle and other decisions.

Finding a competent roofer to install the roof is an important consideration. There was considerable discussion about metal shingle roofs, as well as composition shingles. We hope to get more information about using a metal shingle roof because it should last longer. We can decide what looks appropriate, solid decking, ridge vent, reflective qualities, color, and plastic sheeting in the attic to catch debris and dirt during removal and work. We were encouraged to contact DeWitt Historical Commission about restoration contractors, like those used when the County Courthouse was being restored. Getting a scope of work sheet from the Texas Historical Commission was also mentioned.

Ms. Childs toured the OSC. We considered the possibility of checking if our insurance on the present, approximately 1900 square foot roof, would apply due to possible windstorm damage.
