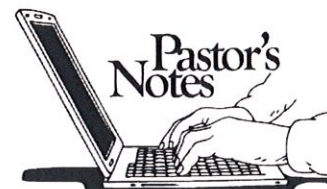

Greetings,

“Woe to the rebellious children,” declares the LORD, “Who execute a plan, but not Mine, and make an alliance, but not of My Spirit, In order to add sin to sin² Who proceed down to Egypt Without consulting Me, to take refuge in the safety of Pharaoh and to seek shelter in the shadow of Egypt! Isaiah 30:1-2



As I was reading this passage from Isaiah I thought of how often we decide what we want to do and when others question it we claim we are convinced it is God’s will. Some claim their idea is God’s will to convince others it is the right thing to do. Some use the claim in order to rationalize to themselves what they are doing is the right thing to do. But is it truly God’s will?

As humans we want to believe that we have all of the right answers, that we know what is best for us. To us our ideas are always the best for us. We have all of the answers. As soon as we convince ourselves of this we are no longer open to the thoughts or advice we receive from others. We become so convinced we are right it overshadows what God is telling us.

So how do we know if it is God’s will for us? How does God tell us what His will is?

First and foremost we have to pray. And once we have prayed we have to listen for God to answer our prayer. How does He speak to us? God speaks to us through scripture, prayer, the Holy Spirit, and other Christians. God’s will never contradicts God’s Word. And that is why it is so important that we stay in God’s Word so we know what God’s Will for us is. We need to listen to what the Holy Spirit is telling us. So often we block this out because it is not what we want to hear. After all, we know what is best for us. Many times the Holy Spirit tells us the answer to our prayers.

Second, we need to know it is God’s word and not our own. We need to do a motive check so we know it is God’s word and not our desire. God’s will for us is not a feeling. God will make it clear to us if it is His will. We must always trust God’s word. We must remember that God has always been faithful to His Word.

Third, we need to stay the course. It is easy to get off track if we don’t see something happening. God wants us to stay on His course for us. And we can do that by staying in His Word, Praying, and listening to what He wants. We need to be patient and obedient.

Fourth, we need to commit ourselves to other believers. How we need to be accountable to one another. Fellowship with other believers will strengthen and sustain us. We should seek their counsel and listen to their thoughts and trust that God is also talking to us through them. We need to truly have an open mind, and above all respect their opinion.

Above all else we should strive to do God’s will. We will be amazed at how much more rewarding our life is when we follow His will. We will also find that peace that we all so desperately seek.

We have to ask God to help and then believe he will. We will make mistakes but fortunately God allows us to make U-turns and come back to his will.

May 26, 2015

CALL to ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Marvin Sager at 7:00 PM.

DEVOTION: Led by Cathie Bettge.

MINUTES: Minutes were reviewed and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed and approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- It has been busy the past couple of months. We have had four adult baptisms and one infant baptism. We have also received five new members and have just received a letter of transfer for the Morgan Goebel family. I need approval from council to receive them as new members. Mitchell made the motion to accept them as transfer members and Cathie Bettge seconded. Motion passed
- I attended a Mission District Pastor Meeting in Seguin on April 14th.
- I have conducted services at Yorktown Manor and Cuero Nursing and Rehab averaging 18 people at each service. We have a service at Yorktown Manor on the second Wednesday each month and Cuero Nursing and Rehab on the third Wednesday of each month.

- The Cemetery custodian has asked for guidance on how to proceed with the next burial plot. Since it was decided to start the new row at the lower end of the cemetery at a previous called council meeting, Johnny moved and Mitchell seconded that the next plot would continue as the row was started. Motion passed.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

- Council has approved Cross Trails Counselors Day Camp. The cost is \$60 per child for a minimum of 30 campers and we are registered for the week of

June 15 – 19, from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm. Heather has mailed letters to each family with registration forms. They will arrive on Sunday June 14 to meet and greet with our congregation. They will send 4 college age counselors and plan to get here for church and we will have probably sandwiches and chips meal after church. Terri Jank (Parish Life committee) will help call volunteers to bring food. Heather is putting announcements in the bulletins and newsletters. Marv and Norrean Sager and Heather & Will Roeske and Cathie and Dickie Bettge have volunteered to house the counselors. J. Burns Cowley and Bryant Roeske have signed up for Jr. Counselors. Kitchen Helpers – possibly Pam Haun and Heather Wendel

YOUTH GROUP ACTIVITIES AND PLANS

- Dawn has a detailed article in the newsletter about all their activities. The Youth Group has been very involved in the posting of the flags and other activities for the Wounded Warriors. Confirmation Camp is June 21st and they will be leaving after church that day. The Youth Group will again present roses to all the women in church on Mother's Day, May 10th.

CONFIRMATION CLASS

- Today, May 3rd was the last class for the Confirmands. They will suspend classes for the summer. Six youth will be confirmed on May 17th

POST CONFIRMATION CLASS

- Heather Roeske is continuing this class with several youth attending.

ADULT CLASS

- This continues to be well attended. They will continue to meet through the summer. Johnny started a new curriculum today.

REGULAR CURRICULUM

- We will try to order from Sola Publishing since this is produced by the NALC, but may want to look at other approved sources if this doesn't seem to be exciting enough. Mary Kate Warner has frequent suggestions on the internet for Sunday School crafts and other info. I am trying to find out more about her. She is a home school supporter. I asked Brenda to ask her WNALC network.

NEED FOR TEACHERS

- Suggestions were: Beth Reinecke and Lee Ann Jander. Use substitutes more often if we give them notice. Maybe Lynzy Moritz? Heather will put more info in bulletins and newsletters. Heather will talk to Candy Cowley about recruiting Lee Ann.

OTHER INFO SINCE THE MEETING:

- The Sunday School attendance has been sporadic. For the past two Sundays we have held the opening in the double room that used to be pastor's office. It's a little crowded but will probably continue this thru the summer. Maybe we could move the table

and rearrange the chairs. The video equipment doesn't have to be moved and can stay set up in this room.

- We are looking for a full size screen to put in that room.
- Pam Haun has agreed to help in the Kitchen for VBS Day Camp.
- We have about 10 campers who have sent registration forms, or email for VBS Day Camp.
- The Property committee has scheduled a meeting on June 7th Monday evening at 7 pm to
- Discuss options for improving the air quality of the basement.

The Property Team

Maintenance Schedule:

June:

Blow and/or vacuum compressor area of refrigerator. Clay.

Seal concrete tables and benches with Thompsons Water Seal. Scheduled for May 27, 5:00 pm-mini work day.

Items Complete.

- Covers for access points at the parsonage have been placed.
- First aid kits checked.
- Kitchen drain line checked.
- Bacteria added to septic systems.
- Carpets cleaned.
- Albrecht and Brandt grave slabs have been leveled. We met with Justin Cooper to review the grave line layout, grave digging fees, and removal of excess dirt after grave settlement.
- AT&T has been emailed about excessive growth in their easement area.

Old Business

- Council approved getting parsonage windows fixed. Ideal Aluminum was contacted and will call to schedule appointment for estimate.
- Crushed limestone for road improvement. We decided to place limestone from the end of the existing cemetery road to the parking lot and around the back of the parish hall. Some of the road will need to be over excavated before placing the limestone to prevent drainage problems. Dickie will compute volumes and get an estimate from Dunn Services.
- Heaving slab at parsonage. Coastal Bend Foundation Repair met with us concerning the slab at the parsonage. They can install supports to restrict the slab from settling, but cannot do anything for swelling of the clay which lifts the slab. Since our problem is both shrink and swell, they cannot help us. His recommendation was to gutter the area and lead the water away to hopefully stabilize the moisture content of the soil. Another thing that we

can do is to attach the slab to the floor joist along the slab when the soil conditions are wet. This will enable the pier and beam section to move with the slab.

They cannot help us with the movement of the chain wall either. Again, this is due to the shrink swell of the soils and it too narrow to stabilize.

New Business:

- Volleyball light fixtures and fencing. We decided to construct a 61" Stay-Tight fence using 3" galvanized pipe for corner and brace posts, 2" galvanized pipe for braces, and galvanized steel T posts. A ladder will be installed on the rear fence. Lighting will be researched further.
- Basement project. A meeting has been scheduled for June 7, at 7:00 to discuss and brainstorm our next step in basement renovations. We hope to have the property team, parish education team and interested council members and church members present at this meeting.

Project List:

- Revision of cemetery rules. We discussed downloading cemetery rules used by the Catholic Churches as a guide to revising our rules. Dickie will download.
- Eagle Scout Project, Dylan Ohrt. Marv stripped the grass, removed roots, and leveled the area with his dozer and the Ohrt family set the brace posts for the gate.
- Name plates for Dan Dentler and Mildred Metting tables and benches and Chad Boyer, Charlene Magee and Quinton trees have arrived.
- Signage to close cemetery at night. Clay had pictures of signage at a Victoria cemetery. Will continue to investigate.
- Inventory of furniture and equipment & report to Church Council. Dickie
- Winterize plumbing at trees. Dickie.
- Install mailboxes at church office. I emailed Heather to notify us if she needs help to install these.
- The slab for the sign has been poured and the sign hung. We have the laptop and have a good radio link to the sign. Our next step is the brickwork and electrical.

Items for Council approval:

- Guttering of short section of parsonage roof to direct water away from the parsonage slab. Kathy moved to proceed with the addition of a gutter at this location, Linda seconded. Motion passed.
- Next meeting on June 14, 8:00 a.m.

Worship Team report

Worship Team rescheduled from the 1st Tuesday and met on Wednesday May 6th. In attendance were Beverly Bodden, Johnny P Jank, Virginia Jank, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Norrean Sager, Marv Sager, Bruce Weise, and Pastor John Boor.

Old Business –

- **Usher program** was discussed that we need to get this going. I will try to assist Don and Mike to help get this started.
- **Readers for Sunday lessons list** has been started with a list being made for the whole year. May need to make sure everyone has gotten a copy for the entire year list.
- **April 19th Sunday Grave Decoration Sunday with Church under the Trees** – We discussed the input from council that we did not do enough to advertise the event and that we need to be consistent with referring to it as Grave Decoration Sunday. The Team felt other factors may have played into the low attendance as well including the previous day's heavy rains and other events. We agreed to make an extra effort to "get the word out", next year.
- **April 26th Sunday – "Water Sunday"** – We reviewed the event and service and all thought it went well.
- **Fill the Church Sunday** – We agree to move that event to the fall.
- **Service Length** and its effect on attendance was discussed. We agreed numerous factors contribute to this "service creep" including 10 to 15 minutes of announcements, extra talks (water Sunday), longer hymns, and others. We all agreed to be more watchful of the "service creep" issue and be more creative with finding ways to cut time without cutting content out of the service.

New Business –

- **Ad in Victoria Advocate** – Two options were reviewed from Victoria Advocated representative Nina Rodriguez. A half page ad in the special

section "Worship in the Crossroads" in December would be \$345.00. This would qualify us for a quarter page article at no additional charge so we could tell a bit more about St John, Meyersville. Also discussed was the Saturday's Faith page runs \$17.35 per column inch. Ex: the Abundant Life Ad upper right side is 2 columns by 1.5" X 17.35 = \$52.05. The ad directly below it is 2 col X 2" X 17.35 = \$69.40. You can put the ad in once a week, once a month, once a quarter, several weeks leading up to a special event. The Team was undecided about how much or how little advertising to do, but thought putting an ad in the December paper might be a place to start, and were seeking input or action from council?

- **"Quiet Bags"** – A suggestion for creating some "quiet bags" to be offered to parents of young children to assist in keeping them occupied during the service. The Team agreed to implement this with about a dozen bags to start. Also we talked about being more proactive about handing out the Children's Bulletin we have in the narthex already.
- **Memorial Day Service May 24th** – Was discussed as we could not get Col Petrash to come speak to us, as he and his wife will be at WestPoint Saturday May 23rd for his son's graduation. (Somehow she said that might keep them for being back on Sunday for our service). Mrs. Petrash had suggested if we wanted to plan something for next year they would entertain booking the Sunday prior to Memorial Day. The Team agreed to engage Col Petrash.
- **Welcoming VBS leaders June 14th** – Since VBS camp counselors will be arriving Sunday June 14th Team discussed introducing them to the congregation during announcements. We agreed to have a commissioning for the youth leaders from our congregation that will be assisting them.
- **Post VBS Sunday June 21st** – Team agreed that VBS presentation take the place of the opening hymn.
- **Anniversary Service** - 2016 St John is 165 years old. Team discussed starting to plan a celebration. It was suggested council may want to start planning with setting a date begin developing committees for the various functions.
- **Contemporary Service** – Team scheduled for 9th of August pending securing music.
- **Assign Songs for Worship** – 17th May, 14th June through 5th July, 2015.
- Next month meeting set for 2nd June @ 7 p.m.

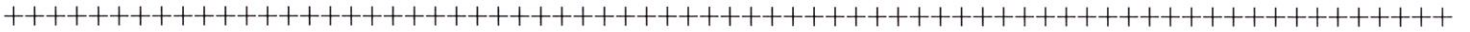
