He served as pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Hobbs, N.M. from 1981-1986 before being called to Saint Luke's Lutheran Church in Colorado Springs in 1986. After serving as pastor of Saint Luke's for 25 years, he was called to serve as Assistant to NALC Bishop John Bradosky, relocating to Columbus, OH in January, 2012. As Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Wendel assists congregations and pastors in the call process, serves as the ecumenical officer of the denomination, and assists the bishop as needed. Pastor Wendel and his wife, Susan Riches, have two adult children, Christopher of Ambridge, PA, and Rebekah of Ft. Bliss, El Paso, Texas. They have two grandsons and two granddaughters.

CALL to ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Marvin Sager at 7:00 PM.

DEVOTION: Led by Mitchell Jank.

MINUTES: Minutes were reviewed and approved. FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed and approved. PASTOR'S REPORT

- First I would like to thank the council and the congregation for sending me to Lutheran Week in Dallas. It was a very rewarding experience. - Bid from Superior Rain Gutters on guttering for the parsonage and garage to keep the roof water away from the parsonage slab is \$1204. Approved by council and Superior notified. Since there was a sewer line and electric line in near proximity, Glenn Ruschhaupt installed the drain for the gutters and Superior installed the gutters. The gutters are installed and the drain is in progress.
- A water hydrant is being installed near the parish hall.
- Basement Renovation: Patrick Ohrt met with the property team and discussed progress on the basement renovation. He provided us with the first drawing on possible lift layout and awnings with lift on the east side of the church. Our first step is to identify possible contractors for demolition of the basement.

New Business:
