Again in Paul's first letter to Timothy 5:18, "The laborer is worthy of his reward."



- Church and parish hall carpets do not need cleaning. Will be cleaned after Bible school if needed.
- Council approved fence on west property line and Robert Kainer was notified. Will start construction in next two weeks.
- Projector screen hung in Sunday school class room.
- A meeting was held on July 17, 2016 at 7:00 pm for congregation members to discuss basement improvements as well as other church renovations.

Old Business

- Insurance requirement policy. Marv met with James Crain III and Mr. Crain's position is that we are adequately covered.
- Surface drainage project underway. The drainage pipe and curb are installed. Final grading is in progress.
- Revision of cemetery rules. A committee consisting of Marv, Dickie, and cemetery committee will review the rules and make recommendations. They will also look into cemetery rules to post.

New Business:

 Patrick Ohrt met with the team to discuss recent bill and needed information for our informational meeting on July 17. Patrick discussed the bill for the basement

- demolition as well as future billing on the total renovation project. We will need to decide if we want to use hourly billing or percentage of project costs billing. Patrick presented two conceptual designs and a cost estimate for basement renovation for consideration at the informational meeting July 17.
- Volley ball light bids. Proposals from Hall Electric and Goyen Electric were discussed. Goyen Electric proposed to do the job turn-key whereas Hall Electric will not give us a turn-key price. The property team felt that the bid of \$4690 is a reasonable price and therefore recommends that we hire Goyen Electric.
- The chain link cemetery fence is being wrecked by the cattle. We will need to construct an electric fence around the cemetery to protect our fence. Dickie will discuss with Daren Otto.
- Use of basement for vacation bible school. The team agreed that the basement in its present condition is unsafe for bible school.

Projects:

- Inventory of furniture and equipment & report to Church Council. Dickie
- Brush clearing at the creek. We will meet to determine what is needed and decide the best method to get accomplished.
- Road to creek. Gravel through the low area. Bryan Nethery has offered to donate one load of gravel. Pastor will contact Bryan.
- Door for lawn mower shed. Britton.
- Patch roof on parish hall. Britton.
- Equipment box at volley ball court. Vance
- Called property team meeting on July 24, 2015. A called meeting of the property team was held after church to discuss the information meeting on church renovations. We had the following recommendations:
 - 1. The property team will recommend to council to set up a fund for the elevator-basement renovations. This fund is to encourage giving toward these renovation projects.

- Recommend that we continue to work with the architect to proceed with final drawings and necessary contracting package for the elevator-basement renovations.
- 3. We also decided to use the left over soil from the drainage project to fill a low area in the church yard if this is agreeable with the contractor.

Items for council approval:

- Approve the bid of \$4690 from Goyen
 Electric for volley ball lights. Motion was
 presented by Dickie and seconded by
 Mitchell. Motion passed.
- Motion was made by Obert to set the date for a called congregation meeting on August 28, 2016 immediately after church services to get approval from the congregation to create an 'Elevator/Basement Fund' to collect funds specific for that project and approval to proceed with architect package, developing drawings, etc. Seconded by Dickie. Motion passed.

Worship Team report

Worship Team met on the 5th of July 2016. Members Beverly Bodden, Johnny P Jank, Virginia Jank, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Norrean Sager, and Bruce Weise were present. Pastor John was on vacation, Marv Sager & Dawn Otto had previous commitments.

Old Business -

- Graduate Sunday was discussed. There were no gradates the original "planned" Sunday of June 12th. We announced it for the following Sunday and Sarah called all parents involved. Will try to plan it better for next year.
- Song choice Sundays were discussed and only singing 2 verses so it might free up some additional time to do a few more selections. Bruce did this for Father's day this year and we may have done one or two more than before. Will continue to use this moving forward.

- Pastor John on Vacation was discussed and Jason Ohrt supplying for that Sunday. Johnny had talked to him and let him know if he needed anything the Worship Team was there to help. He sounded like all was going well with his preparation and he was ready.
 - POST NOTE: (Worship Team held the meeting prior to the service) Jason did a wonderful job with the service, the children's message, the sermon, and the prayers. We heard nothing but praise for a job well done. St John is certainly blessed to have him as a resource to help in Pastor John's absence.
- Contemporary Service is scheduled for July 31st service. We will have Dave Eihler and their praise band 'Broken Vessels' from Flatonia to bless us with live music for that Sunday's service. We need to get the word out for this event.
- Confirmation robes and the need to update ours due to the current condition of the existing ones was discussed. We did not have information to review so it will be on next month's Old Business. We will try to acquire some information regarding options to replace the existing ones.

New Business -

- Rally Sunday was discussed and we talked about how the service might incorporate that theme. We will check with Parish Ed if changes need to be made and we chose "Have No Fear, Little Flock" (476 LBW) and "Jesus Loves Me" for song selections for that morning.
- A brief explanation of the scripture lessons was discussed. Some lectionary inserts give a brief explanation prior to each lesson. Since time is a consideration, we will look into the possibility of just putting this information into the bulletin instead of adding to the readings. - Bruce asks that we consider looking into the possibility of getting the air pump and motor of the organ into an area that would supply conditioned air to the organ. This would be a property team issue and there is an informational meeting at which this could be addressed. We will also research this with future information to be relayed to the Property Team to consider during the potential renovation plans.
- There being no additional new business brought to the Team we assigned songs for worship for the Sundays from the 14th of August through the 4th of September 2016.
- Next month's meeting is scheduled for the 2nd of August @ 7:00PM.


