

Happy Fall to All!

During the holiday season coming up, we have lots of opportunities to be thankful and to bless those around us – what a wonderful time of the year! At the same time, one can become stressed by all the extras, so that one may make some unwise decisions. So, lets stop and think about this for a minute, how to guard against excesses that can detract from our celebrations.

Our Lord Jesus Christ is quoted in Matthew 15 as saying, "...everything that goes into the mouth passes into the stomach and is eliminated. But the things that proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and those defile the man." So, this is talking about what we eat and what we say, both areas that can be considered in the context of holiday tensions (not to mention spending).

Regarding the eating and drinking, we know that moderation is a cornerstone of our faith – self-control is "fruit" of the Holy Spirit, evidence of His presence with us. 
