The House of Dreams is a Scholarship Program for homeless women and their children.

The heart of the program is to embrace and strengthen their potential equipping them for a better future. Each resident will be provided with a room and living space for them (and their children if they have children), food, on-site day care and onsite guidance 24/7. They will participate in an Intern Program learning marketable skills that will allow them to become self-sufficient. The home will be a Christ-centered home of second chances, promoting self-sufficiency, emphasizing teamwork in a compassionate, caring, positive and encouraging environment. Women will be able to sustain themselves based on improved skills and technical skills taught at House of Dreams. They will learn honor and a healthy self-respect to maximize personal growth and save children from a life of dependency, crime, poverty and hopelessness

The home will be able to house 13 to 15 women, and have two paid staff members.

House of Dreams is a 501C3 organized under the leadership of Faith Family Church in Victoria.

 - Architect progress. Mary and I met with Patrick and Mr. Atkinson concerning plastering of the basement. He said that the plaster that is on the walls is a gypsum plaster which by nature is softer and tends to flake like is currently happening. He recommends a concrete based plaster which will be harder and much more durable. The harder plaster is less desirable from the standpoint of acoustics. He would attach lathes into the clay tiles and put the plaster (about .75" thick) on the lathes. The sand based plaster will have a white color. He said that the church cracks could be fixed by routing the cracks and placing new plaster. He should be able to match the paint on the walls. Scaffolding would be necessary which will run up the cost. Patrick provided a cost estimate for suspended ceiling in the basement as follows:

2'x4' tiles

\$5,200

2'x2' tiles

\$7,700

Plaster with sand finish: \$18,900.

The team recommended getting a cost estimate to come up with a bid ready package from Patrick.

Worship Team members, Beverly Bodden, Pastor John Boor, Johnny P Jank, Virginia Jank, Dawn Otto, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Marv Sager, Norrean Sager, and Bruce Weise met Tuesday 7th February, 2017.

Old Business discussed included:

Confirmation robes – The Team has been renewing the needs of St John in regards to replacing the current robes which had been primarily used for Confirmation. One of the sources we had been considering was CM Almy, a well-known church supply company. Bruce has used them as a resource and recently received a flyer regarding their robes being on sale. The Team reviewed some of the offerings by CM Almy and found one that would meet our needs for \$93.00, which with the discount would run approximately \$80.00. The other source we looked at was "Graduationsource.com". This is where MISD purchases

their gowns for 8th grade graduation ceremony. They had a Matte White gown for \$22.95 each. Team discussed both the options and decided the graduation source gowns may not be the same quality as the Almy gowns, but we are not using these gowns each Sunday, we probably will only use these once a year. At the lower price we could purchase 4 for every one of the more expensive gowns. We may have as many as nine young adults being confirmed on 21st of May. The Team considered that date will get here before you know it so we decided we should make a decision. Dawn moved to purchase 10 of the Matte White gowns from graduationsource.com at a price of \$20.95. There is a price break at 10 pieces so the 10th gown only cost us an additional \$2.95. Bev seconded the motion. After some discussion about whether the expenditure was budgeted, it was agreed that this expenditure would fall under the \$2,500.00 budgeted for Worship Supplies. The motion then passed unanimously. Pastor John would measure the Confirmands to get the sizes to order. This was completed by Carol Ann and Virginia in Pastor John's absence.

LBW book repairs- The book repairs are complete but Virginia is still working on the bookmarks.

Lent – We will change to 2nd setting in LBW for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Sundays during the Lenten season.

Reformation Sunday Celebration — We discussed ideas for the Reformation Sunday. Bruce mentioned a video on the life of Martin Luther that we might plan showing on consecutive Sundays. We talked about continuing to add ideas to focus on Martin Luther and the Reformation.

New Business discussed included:

A Confirmation Service that Pastor John had experience with at a previous church was reviewed and discussed. The Team all agreed that the service really involved the Confirmands and their parents. Pastor John said he will modify it to use for this year's May 21st confirmation.

Clay Crockett and 204 Ministries were featured in a local magazine article that Dawn brought to the Team's attention. Crockett is offering to supply live contemporary music for churches that, either don't have a regular contemporary praise band or just need a supply band to take the place of their regular music. We have contemporary services planned for 23rd of April and for 30th of June. Beverly agreed to contact Clay Crockett and see if he would be available for either date. We will try to contact Broken Vessels, the band that played for us last year, to play for the other date.

There being no additional business for the Team we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Next month's meeting will be the 7th March 2017 @ 7:00PM.

Other Council New Business:

Graduation Recognition Sunday will be May 14, 2017. Memorial Day Services will be May 28 with Veteran Recognition with an Honor Guard presentation and Col. Petrash and Nick Lowery participating. There is some interest in doing the Living Last Supper again at St. John Meyersville. Material is being compiled for this possibility. The Tomb will again be a part of the Easter story as in years past. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


