¹⁹For I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, 20 as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. ²²If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. ²⁵Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again. ²⁷Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ and not frightened in anything by your opponents. This is a clear sign to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God. ²⁹For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake, ³⁰engaged in the same conflict that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. 6And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? 14Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. ¹⁵Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' ¹⁶So the last will be first, and the first last."

Items needed: NALC Disaster Response

Anything you can do to help, would be greatly appreciated!

Flood Buckets: 5-gallon buckets w/ lid, 2 one-quart bottles of bleach or a gallon of bleach, rubber gloves, work gloves, large, heavy duty plastic bags (30-45 gallon size), room deodorizer, scrub brush, sponges, 100-ft. clothes line or two 50-ft., antibacterial soap, scouring pads, reusable wipes, dust masks, two 25-oz. or one 50-oz. liquid soap, insect repellent spray.

Other needed items: Shovels, rakes, garden hoses, tarps, tools to remove debris(such as wet flooring), mops, gas cans, BIBLES, bottled water, baby diapers & formula, feminine hygiene products, hand sanitizer gel or wipes, Non-perishable food items, pet food, paper plates, plastic eating utensils, paper towels, gift cards (Home Depot, Lowe's, Target, Walmart)






