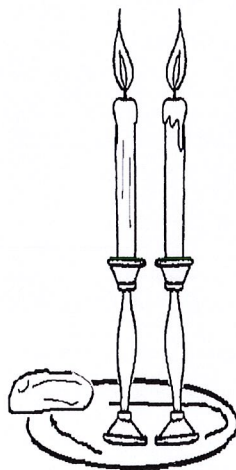


Stevenson's Unit Prison Ministry

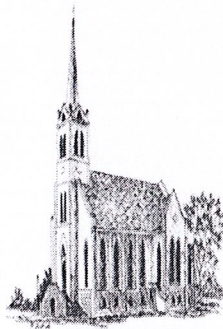

Old Business discussion included:

Reformation Sunday Celebration – The Team discussed showing a video on Martin Luther’s life. Options of showing it in the evening or during the Sunday school hour were discussed and the Team decided to show it during the Sunday morning Sunday school hour for improved attendance. Johnny was looking into a SOLA published Luther skit that may get used for another event or during a Sunday morning service.

Hearing impaired aid – Will implement July 16th Sunday with an announcement at the beginning of the service and again the following Sunday.

New Business discussion included:

Contemporary service with Clay Crockett’s 204 Ministries on July 30th was confirmed. The Team discussed the order of worship and announcing the Camp Counselors, whom will be arriving that Sunday morning in advance of VBS the following week. We also discussed continuing to use some contemporary music and songs on our SOTW services on the 4th Sunday of the month. 6th August service was discussed regarding the inclusion VBS material. Parish Education Team will have to let us know what they may want to do.

Organ repair and maintenance was discussed. Sensing we may need a second opinion on the condition and need for planned repairs we contacted an alternate vendor to give us a second opinion on the state of our pipe organ. The vendor Shawn Sanders, owner of Pipe Organ Technicians came and inspected our organ and chimes and submitted the attached report. After receiving the report I sent Mr. Sanders a reply by email and asked him to give us some numbers for

his suggested maintenance issues. Worship Team will keep the council informed as more information is received.

Mission Sunday on the 10th September was briefly discussed. Other than a guest speaker and meal to follow this will be a regular service.

Altar Candelabras are in need of being refurbished. A suggestion was made that we investigate having them resurfaced to bronze to match the other altar furnishings. Carol Ann suggested we find out if any one knows how we obtained the candelabras and make sure it’s ok with whoever may have been involved with getting them initially. She will work with that as well.

Team then assigned songs for worship for 16th July through 10th September 2017

Closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

Next meeting – Schedule as necessary-- **Next scheduled 1st August 2017 @ 7:00PM**

DISCUSSION: Pastor John will be gone Oct. 1 and Oct 8. Oct. 1 is a communion Sunday and we will need a supply pastor for that Sunday. Johnny has been talking to Jason Ohrt who is willing to fill in when the Pastor is gone and may do the service on Oct. 8.

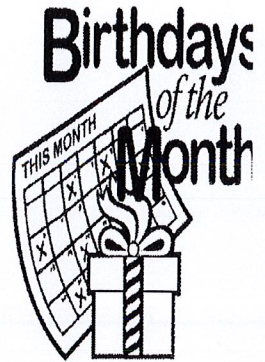

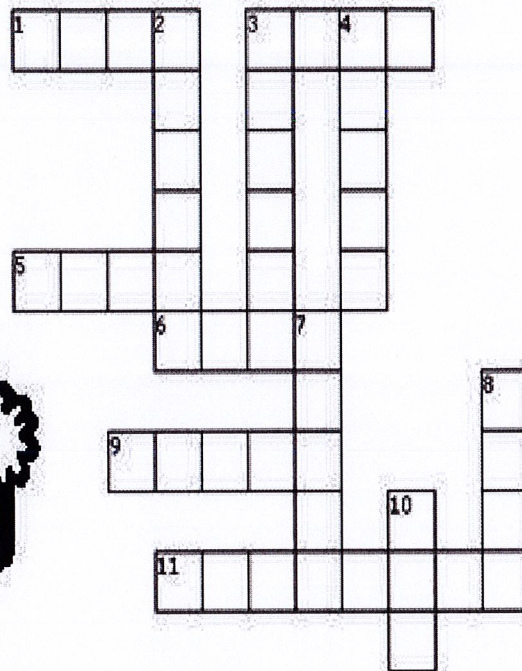
