CALL TO ORDER: President Marv Sager called the meeting to order. Terri Jank opened the meeting with a devotion referring to the statement "be still and know that I am God". We are too busy, trying to get everything done, we need to slow down and take time for Christ.

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Linda Ruschhaupt, 2nd by Dickie Bettge, and approved. **FINANCIAL REPORT:** Reviewed, Motion to accept by Glenn Ruschhaupt, 2nd by Terri Jank and approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT

The convocation was informative. The focus was obviously on the 500th anniversary of the reformation. We had several speakers about the reformation one of which was a Presbyterian that renounced her ordination when the PCA started ordaining gays.

The five days were pretty well organized by the Counselors. Special thanks to all the volunteers: Pam Haun, Joie Caskey, Parish Life group, Beth and Leroy Reinecke, Laurie and John Pokluda (hosts for the counselors).

Rally Sunday and Back Pack Blessing - we were very disappointed at the low attendance on August 13th. Only 15 youth attended the Sunday School hour and even less stayed for church for the blessing. However those that attended were thoroughly entertained with Christian games and crafts. Several parents attended and helped with the games. We had four stations with four volunteers: M'Liss Moore. Pam Haun, Laurie Pokluda, and Joie Caskey, and teacher LeAnn Jander. We plan to have the same stations (except the Bounce House) next Sunday to use the material. Parish Life provided delicious Fruit Pizza to highlight our Fruit of the Spirit theme. The back pack blessing held during church was very well done, with excellent responsive readings provided in the Back Pack Kit. Johnny did a great job with this too!

WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

Worship Team members Beverly Bodden, Pastor John Boor, Johnny P Jank, Virginia Jank, Dawn Otto, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Marv Sager, Norrean Sager, and Bruce Weise met on Tuesday evening the 1st of August, 2017 at 7:00PM in the Parish Hall. Johnny opened with a prayer.

Old Business discussed included: Reformation Sunday Celebration – Additional ideas concerning Reformation Sunday were

discussed. We agreed that Sunday should be a communion service. It will be a 5th Sunday of the month.

Hearing impaired aid – Johnny announced the devices but to date has not had any one use them. We will try to see if we can be a little more proactive about getting them into the hands of some who might benefit from them. This discussion led to a suggestion about getting a speaker into the cry room. Johnny will get that done.

New Business discussion included:

Contemporary services – Discussion around the most recent service on 30th of July with Clay Crockett and Nation of God was all positive. It was mentioned that we might plan the service prior to VBS, next year when the camp counselors would be there, as a separate contemporary service and use them as a resource for our music, as they clearly could have done that this year had we not already had a band scheduled.

Organ repair and maintenance – At the Worship Team meeting discussion around getting comparable recommendations from both Shawn Sanders and Mike Morgan on the items addressed in the inspection report. We did not have that information at that time so discussion and any action was tabled. Since then I have received information from both vendors and this is attached in the form of a comparative spread sheet. A brief history of the recent organ issues may be helpful as well. George Price of Houston had maintained our organ since the fall of 2013 at a cost of \$1,700.00 per year plus any additional repairs or parts if necessary. Mr. Price died and his assistant Mike Morgan took over the account and the semi-annual maintenance of our organ. Over the last year Bruce Weise has made the Worship Team aware that some of the repairs that Mike was making were not seeming to hold up. Whether that was to the fault of the age and state of our organ or the capabilities of Mike Morgan was in question. To investigate this further Worship Team agreed to find an alternative organ repair vendor and request an evaluation of our organ for comparison. Bruce contacted some associates in the organist community and several recommended Shawn Sanders of Pipe Organ Technicians. Mr. Sanders was contacted and subsequently made an inspection and submitted a report. We then asked him to give some costs to his recommendations. During the discussion Worship Team felt we should present the results of the inspection to Mike Morgan and let him respond as well and make cost estimates where appropriate. Both have now sent information back and that is what I have tried to compile in the attached spread sheet. **6**th **August**, the Sunday after VBS was discussed, and since Kathy would not be there and Wanda had not been at VBS, they decided to incorporate the VBS message in the Rally Sunday service.

Rally Sunday is scheduled for 13th August. Pastor John will be leaving the convocation and heading to Ohio on vacation. Johnny will lead the worship. We talked about a service centered on the planned Rally Sunday celebration during the Sunday school hour. We will have the children lead us in the "Fruits of the Spirit" song by the FishDotComGuys. Kathy had suggested we might also use something from VBS, but we didn't have that yet. Johnny also shared he might do some research on information of Martin Luther's writings on Christian education and the importance he gave it in the "future of the Church." We will also have a special litany for blessing the children's backpacks.

Mission Sunday will be 10th September and currently it will be a regular LBW service with the message by Pastor Wanda Ulrey and Leslie Rabke of the Stevenson Prison Unit Ministry.

October 1st and 8th will be the other Sundays Pastor John will be on vacation. Jason Ohrt was asked and has agreed to lead worship on the 8th of October. The 1st of October, obviously is the 1st Sunday of the month and a communion Sunday and we will need to find a supply pastor for that Sunday.

Altar Candelabras refurbished – Carol Ann is continuing to research that and will update as she gets information.

There being no **Other New Business Worship Team Assigned Songs for Worship** for 17th September through 29th of October 2017.

We then closed with the Lord's Prayer.

 functionality.
- We decided to junk the old lawn mower.
 Brian said that he was taking a load of scrap at which time he could dispose of the lawn mower.
- Brian informed us of wood ants at the wing door (parsonage side). Marv will notify pest management person.
- We have noticed spider webs on church pews. Marv will notify Bonnie.

- Marv will have the church carpets cleaned. Projects:
 - Inventory of furniture and equipment & report to Church Council. Dickie
 - Pressure wash & paint pump house.
 - Seal concrete tables and benches with Thompsons Water Seal
 - Install light bulb at cemetery
