Christmas Families Mission Statement

We have two Christmas Families:

The first Christmas Family decided there were folks much worse off than themselves. Social services of CISD has selected another family for our First Christmas Family. The family is a single mother of four children. According to the social services coordinator this mother has also done a great job with her children. Following are their sizes if anyone would chose to purchase clothes: If you do we ask that you include a gift receipt in the event the garment did not fit, etc. Also keep in mind that CISD has a dress code to follow so one should check that out before you make the purchase.

The second is a family who has come to us with high recommendations from the CISD family services coordinator. The family has a mom and dad who have three children of their own and who have also taken in two other children who belong to the mom's sister. The parents are concerned and come to parent/teacher meetings for all. The children make good grades and are well behaved. The parents both work at low paying jobs and sacrifice for the wellbeing of the children. Teacher, counselors and other faculty helped in the selection of this family. The coordinator said this family deserves something good to happen to them.

Reformation 500 Moments with Martin Luther

In October of 1520 Martin Luther wrote his second of three treatises defining his theological position concerning teachings in the Church. In his article, "On the Babylonian Captivity of the Church," he took on the subject of Communion in both kinds. In his day, only clergy were permitted to drink from the cup at Holy Communion. While Luther did not condemn the practice of giving the laity only the bread, he urged the church authorities to read the Scriptures and see that Jesus instituted the Holy Supper so that all people would partake of both bread

There were several priests who took Luther on by writing letters back to him. Luther remained unimpressed by their arguments for the use of one kind with the laity. He called them "hornets" and refused to speak or write their names in his response because he did not want them to gain fame by his mentioning them. Luther ridiculed their arguments which he said were typical of those who were against him because they "assert the very thing which they attack." They equated the command of Christ with the decisions of the Church even though clearly they did not understand what Jesus was actually saying when he said, "This cup is the new testament in my blood. Drink of it all of you."

Frustrated and desiring that all people would know God's grace in Christ Jesus fully, Luther concluded concerning the Sacrament of Holy Communion, "To deny reception in both kinds to the laity is an act of impiety and tyranny, and one not in the power of any angel, much less of any Pope or Council whatever."
