



Matt opened the meeting with a devotion based on a passage from the book of Amos, on "Your Unique Calling" emphasizing that each person is special, has special talents and is called to use their special talents to lead others to Christ and witness to others in their everyday lives.

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Linda, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dickie, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Johnny, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Matt and approved.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

#### Items Complete.

- Rock Engineering & Testing was selected for geotechnical work for a price of \$2,500. Core drill performed on Sept. 7, 2017. Report received on 9/23/17.
- A/C filters changed.

#### Old Business.

- Architect progress. Results of the Geotechnical report indicate that we will need to remove 4'-6' of soil beneath the finished slab and replace with select fill to counteract the shrink swell clay that is present. Patrick will provide a drawing production schedule.
- The Cemetery committee met on Aug. 2 to work on revised rules. Draft revised rules were distributed to the property team and church council. Council approval requested.
- Parsonage windows needing replacement (8). Ideal Aluminum has been contacted to obtain pricing. Windows were installed.
- Church septic system was opened. The tanks are not full of sludge, but the water is backing up. Apparently there are problems with the drain field. Further investigation is being done.

#### **New Business:**

- Tree damage from Harvey. One of the young trees in the cemetery was split. We will try and save the tree for now.
- Barn damage from Harvey. Lost barn into Joel's pasture. Darren Otto removed the barn and hauled away.
- Mini work day with team members was conducted on 9/13/17 at 5:00 pm to trim damaged trees.
- Roof damage from Harvey was reported to Church Mutual. We have an appointment with an adjuster on Oct. 3 at 8:00 am.
- Discussion of trimming large tree limb hanging over cemetery and broken tombstones. Will need to look at and determine course of action.

#### Projects:

- Inventory of furniture and equipment & report to Church Council. Dickie
- Pressure wash & paint pump house.
- Seal concrete tables and benches with Thompsons Water Seal

- Install light bulb at cemetery
- Check Church septic system.

Renovation Fund Balance: \$232,948. (9/10/17). Items for Council Approval: Council Approval of revised Cemetery Rules.

Still trying to see if we can get a cast together for a Luther skit during the service. **Hearing impaired** devices were talked about and we are seeing some use by a few folks and we will continue to encourage their use as needed. Johnny will get a couple more headsets as they seem to be the more preferred method of use.

#### New Business -

Contemporary services and the effort to try to incorporate contemporary music into our SOTW Sunday was discussed. Some members seem to really like the effort and others are not as enthused. We missed a planned contemporary service the weekend of hurricane Harvey and will try to schedule another before years end.

**Organ repair and maintenance** issue was discussed at length. We reviewed the information from our current maintenance contractor Mike Morgan and the information from Shawn Sanders with Organ Tech. Both vendors have suggested repairs that are costly (\$5K - \$15K) and both

have suggested rebuild or replacement possibilities which carry an even bigger price tag. Since we are currently in a building project the Worship Team would recommend to Council that we continue to use our current contractor, Mike Morgan, to continue to maintain our current organ with its current system until we can get the current building project completed and then revisit the whole organ issue. This of course would be predicated on the hope that no major failure happens in the meantime.

**Mission Sunday** plans were reviewed and moving along as scheduled.

October 1<sup>st</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> will be Sundays Pastor John will be on vacation. We discussed services and planned to have Jason Ohrt lead the worship on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October. The 1<sup>st</sup> of October, obviously is the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month and a communion Sunday. Worship Team agreed we would need to find a supply pastor for that Sunday.

\*\* Since our meeting we have not been able to find a pastor to serve on that Sunday. I did get to talk to a person who was recommended by Pastor John Waak, former pastor at Our Savior Victoria (who is currently serving as interim pastor in Alice). Jason Eliot who has graduated from seminary with a master of theology degree, but decided not to go into parish ministry and has not been ordained. Based on previous discussions with council I didn't feel comfortable asking Jason to lead a communion service so I would ask for Council's approval to only have the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in October the 15<sup>th</sup> and the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday the 29<sup>th</sup> (which we planned to have a communion service) as the 2 communion services in October.



#### Meaning of Thanksgiving Praise to God

Let us come before him with thanksgiving.

In the Bible, the meaning of thanksgiving reflected adoration, sacrifice, praise, or an offering. Thanksgiving was a grateful language to God as an act of worship.

Rarely, if ever, was thanksgiving extended

to any person or thing, except God. "These things I remember as I pour out my soul; how I used to go with the multitude, leading the procession to the house of God, with shouts of joy and thanksgiving among the festive throng" (Psalm 42:4). Long before the colonists celebrated their successes, Nehemiah assembled two great choirs to give thanks for God's faithfulness in rebuilding the wall. "... The Levites were sought out from where they lived and were brought to Jerusalem to celebrate joyfully and dedication with songs of thanksgiving and with the music of cymbals, harps, and lyres" (Nehemiah 12:27).

The true meaning of Thanksgiving focuses upon relationship. Thanksgiving is a relationship between God and man. Upon their arrival at New Plymouth, the Pilgrims composed <u>The Mayflower Compact</u>, which honored God. Thanksgiving begins with acknowledging God as faithful, earnestly giving Him thanks, in advance, for His abundant blessings. ". . . In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" (<u>Philippians 4:6</u>). Thanksgiving is an attitude of the heart that reinforces an intimate relationship with God.
