The first is two brothers. Both men are disabled with many health problems. Their house is in bad repair and they struggle paying day to day bills. They have no transportation and rely on family members to take them to necessary appointments and to supplement their meager incomes. Family members help them but as they also age it has become more difficult for all them.

Family #2

The first Christmas Family decided there were folks much worse off than themselves. Social services of CISD has selected another family for our second Christmas Family. The family is a single mother of four children. According to the social services coordinator this mother has also done a great job with her children. Following are their sizes if anyone would chose to purchase clothes: If you do we ask that you include a gift receipt in the event the garment did not fit, etc. Also keep in mind that CISD has a dress code to follow so one should check that out before you make the purchase.



Christ the King Sunday, Proper 29 (Year A)

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the church celebrates the identity of Christ as King of kings.
