Confession and Absolution

- L When the days drew near for him to be taken up, Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem to die on the cross for us.
- C So we set our faces to the cross of Christ this day and face the fact that we have not always dealt well with one another.
- L From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised
- C We are truly sorry for all the sins that sent you to suffer on the cross for us, and we ask you to be merciful to us for so often failing to turn to you when we face struggles in this life.
- L I tell you the truth, in the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. Although he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him,

- C His suffering on the cross assures us that any type of suffering we may endure in this life will be removed in the life to come.
- L For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort and forgiveness.
- C We thank you, Jesus, for facing suffering on the cross for our forgiveness, and thank you for the comfort that you bring amidst the suffering we face. Amen.

The Season of Lent • Year B

The general tone for worship during Lent should be reflective without being somber. Simplicity in liturgical elements and hymnody is conducive to setting the appropriate tone. As part of the reflective nature of this season, there is an emphasis on repentance. In the early church, Lent was the period when new believers experienced the catechumenate in preparation for the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. In this season, we are not only reminded of Jesus' faithful and intentional journey to the cross, but also of his calling for us to "take up the cross" and follow him.
