

Greetings,

What difference does Easter make? Does it really matter? How does it impact the way you live your life on a daily basis? Even people who believe Jesus rose from the grave on the third day sometimes have difficulty articulating its relevancy to their lives.

Bill and Gloria Gaither have written many wonderful Christian songs. Gloria wrote one in particular in the 1960's came while she was expecting her first child. The couple was going through some terrible problems. Bill had been seriously sick; their music had been criticized for not being spiritual enough. On New Year's Eve, Gloria writes, "I sat alone in the darkness thinking about the rebellious world and all of our problems—and about our baby yet unborn. Who in their right mind would bring a child into a world like this?" But then something happened. She said, "I can't quite explain what happened in that next moment, but suddenly I felt released from it all. The panic that had begun to build inside was gently dispelled by a reassuring presence and a soft voice that kept saying, 'Don't forget the empty tomb, don't forget the empty tomb.' Then I knew I could have that baby and face the future with optimism and trust for I had been reminded that it was all worth it just because He lives." Out of that experience she wrote the lyrics: "Because He lives I can face tomorrow, because He lives all fear is gone, because I know He holds the future. And life is worth the living just because He lives."


When Jesus got up and walked out of that tomb, he changed everything—for you, for me, for the whole world.

When Jesus appeared to his disciples that first Easter Sunday, the first words out of his mouth were, "Peace be with you!" (John 20:19). The peace Jesus spoke of was more than just a sense of calmness or tranquility. It was the Hebrew word shalom and it was pregnant with meaning. It meant wholeness, completeness, serenity, and harmony of life. At the very center of this peace is peace with God—reconciliation with the one who breathed life into the universe.

Easter does make a difference. Easter is so much more than candy, colored eggs, and cartoon bunnies—Easter is the cornerstone of the Christian faith; the celebration of Jesus rising from the grave, conquering death and giving us peace with God, a purpose for life and the promise of heaven.







CALL TO ORDER: President Marv Sager called the meeting to order. Marv opened the meeting with a devotion on God speaking thru his Word based on Psalm 119:105. The article also brought out how the Word impacted Tom Landry's life.

PASTOR'S REPORT

I attended the pastor's conference in San Antonio earlier this month. The Bishop outlined some changes he hopes to make in the near future.

At the seminary he is concerned that they don't have a class in practical ministry. He says the students come out of the seminary with great book knowledge but don't know what to really expect when they are called to a church and he wants a class to prepare them for the realities of being a pastor.

He has already changed the intern program. Historically students would go to seminary for two years and then have a year intern followed by another year of classroom. He has changed this practice. It had become a problem due to the fact that after the last year of seminary they would basically be floating until they had a call.

Consequently, he has changed the program. They now go to seminary for three years and then have a one-year internship. Once they have successfully completed the internship they remain at the church where they interned until they receive a call.

There has also been conversation and planning to change the structure of the NALC. The Executive Council is preparing a presentation for acceptance at the convocation to add Regional Assistant Bishops. The travel of the Bishop has become unwieldly. There are several times where the Bishop has been traveling for 27-30 days at a time. I have attached a slide presentation that they presented at the meeting that outlines how this will work.

If they come in high, we will need to go back to the insurance company for an adjustment to the adjuster's estimate. After this, we can go back to the

top bidders and get an adjustment for GAF High Definition fiberglass shingles as used on the OSC and possibly use 30 Lb. felt or the Tiger Paw synthetic underlayment that was used on the OSC. We will require Liability insurance and Workers Comp. The following is a list of possible contractors:
