





The home will be a Christ-centered home of second chances, promoting self- sufficiency, emphasizing teamwork in a compassionate, caring, positive and encouraging environment. Women will be able to sustain themselves based on improved skills and technical skills taught at House of Palms. They will learn honor and a healthy selfrespect to maximize personal growth and save children from a life of dependency, crime, poverty and hopelessness

The home will be able to house 13 to 15 women, and have two paid staff members.



#### PARISH LIFE TEAM REPORT

There was no report. **DISCUSSION**: The veterans will be presented with small mementoes at our Veterans Day Service. Suggestion was made to have punch and cookies after the service for acceptance of new members.

# PROPERTY TEAM REPORT COUNCIL REPORT 5/22/18

Team Members: Dickie Bettge, Marv Sager, Pastor John, Brent Gohmert, Clay Haun, Vance Egg, Glenn Ruschhaupt. We did not hold a regularly scheduled meeting this month since the scheduled meeting fell on Mother's Day. On May 10, 2018 a property meeting was called to discuss and make recommendations concerning the Church renovation. The following items were considered:

- 1. A list of elevator questions was compiled based upon issues that Zion Lutheran Church is having with their elevator. These issues were presented to Home Elevator and they provided responses. After discussion we agreed that the answers were satisfactory and we felt that the elevator proposed is the right elevator for us.
- 2. The awning options that were proposed by the contractors to reduce the cost of the awning were discussed in length. The property team does not recommend the aluminum awning options for the following reasons:
  - a. They would not have standing seam roofs.
  - b. They would probably have exposed fasteners.
  - c. We were not familiar with how they would look.
  - d. We didn't feel that the aluminum would hold up as well as the metal roofs would.
- 3. We discussed contractor qualifications/reputation. References were called. We decided that both contractors were qualified to do our job.

- 4. We recommend alternate 1, sump pump and alternate 2, de-humidifier. We felt that we needed these items before water and mold problems arise.
- 5. We discussed the two remaining canopy options at length. The original canopy as shown in the plans looks nice, and fits with the existing building. It would have a standing seam roof and The disadvantages are that the main structure is red iron and will definitely need to be painted regularly, and it is higher priced. The Pre-Engineered Metal Building (PEMB) would not have soffits exposing the underside of the structure and would not be as appealing to the eye. The main structure would be constructed of galvanized steel and may or may not need to be painted depending on how the galvanized steel looks. The galvanized coating is very weather resistant and the PEMB structure would cost less. It would also have a standing seam roof.
- 6. We discussed methods of funding the project as we lack sufficient funds to build the entire project if both canopy and elevator are selected.

The council will be presented these options at a called meeting on May 11, 2018. They will decide on the options to present to the congregation.

**DISCUSSION**: The drafting of the contract for the renovation is in the process. There was also a reminder that there is an invoice from Rawley McCoy for \$40,000 of which \$10,000 has been paid to date.

#### **WORSHIP TEAM REPORT**

Worship Team members Beverly Bodden, Pastor John Boor, Johnny P Jank, Virginia Jank, Dawn Otto, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Marv Sager, Norrean Sager, and Bruce Weise met at the parish house on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May, 2018 at 7:00PM.

Old Business included a discussion regarding:

Altar Candle holders being refurbished. It was agreed to continue with our plan to send them to CM Almy for evaluation as to whether they can be A) resurfaced to a bronze finish, B) refinished to the current silver finish, C) we possibly replace them with new ones.

Organ repair and maintenance is becoming a necessity. The Team discussed the current "patching as we go" repairs we have been doing. Concerns that we may need an alternative to the current technician, Mike Morgan were expressed. A motion was made by Pastor John and seconded by Dawn Otto to contact Shawn Sanders with Pipe Organ Technicians to have him come and attempt repairs based on our organ's current status. This might give us a little more insight to his abilities and his pricing prior to needing a quote from him should our organ fail in the future. Motion passed.

Contemporary service held on 29<sup>th</sup> April had a poor attendance (55) and the Team agreed those who were there, were not as familiar with some of the songs. The only one that had a noticeable participation was the old favorite, "I Love to Tell the Story" recording by Allan Jackson. Ways to improve the contemporary worship experience were discussed. Next service will be 29<sup>th</sup> of July with Dave Eihler and Broken Vessels ministries and live music. The Team was encouraged to find other sources for groups that might assist us with our contemporary services, as we have scheduled the 30<sup>th</sup> of September and 30<sup>th</sup> of December that for contemporary services.

#### New Business -

**Graduation Recognition Sunday** is scheduled for 20<sup>th</sup> May. Pastor John suggested we incorporate this with new member recognition as well. Parish Life team will be contacted to host a small social after the service.

Communion by Stations – Worship Team agreed with the suggestion that the communion assistant on organ side and Pastor John move to east wing and commune members there first then move to normal stations and begin distribution as currently.

**Memorial Day Service** is scheduled for 27<sup>th</sup> of May. Nick Lowery will deliver the message. Col Mike Petrash will be here and we will have a video.

**Council meeting discussion items** were discussed and addressed by the Worship Team.

- 1) A request to add a brief synopsis of the lectionary readings prior to each being read. SOLA does not include this with their lectionary offering. We could get something from the SOLA worship planner they publish. After some discussion Worship Team agreed to add the explanation to the bulletin. NOTE: This was "tweeked" after the first week to eliminate the confusion between the explanation and the actual scripture message.
- 2) Make an attempt encourage congregation to use the pew Bible in church. Worship Team agreed anything to encourage additional Bible reading is a good suggestion. Although, since we already print the readings in the bulletin the "Bible" reading is already being encouraged by it being available in the bulletin. For those who would read the lesson from the pew Bible, the Team agreed to put the pew Bible page number after the reading in the bulletin.
- 3) Each Team should have a "Wish List" to give to families, looking for ways to utilize memorial monies in meaningful ways. Each Worship Team member was encouraged to come up with ideas and discuss at future meetings.

There being no additional business the Worship Team assigned songs for the 6<sup>th</sup> of May through 8<sup>th</sup> of July, then closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting is scheduled for 3<sup>rd</sup> of July @ 7:00PM.

**DISCUSSION:** Johnny is thinking of setting up speakers and video equipment in the Parish Hall for the Sunday Services during the renovation so that everyone will be able to attend the services.

# Did You Know?



Independence Day, also referred to as the Fourth of July or July Fourth, is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies regarded themselves as a new nation, the United States of America, and were no longer part of the British Empire. The Congress actually voted to declare independence two days earlier, on July 2.

Independence Day is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, and

political speeches and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. Independence Day is the National Day of the United States.

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it two days later on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and <u>Benjamin Franklin</u> all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly

a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4 as is commonly believed.

Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as President, also died on July 4, 1831. He was the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872; so far he is the only U.S. President to have been born on Independence Day.
