Confession

With humble and repentant hearts, let us confess our sins unto God our Father.

First Reading

Exodus 12:1-7

12 Now the LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² "This month shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the first month of the year to you. ³ Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying, 'On the tenth of this month they are each one to take a lamb for themselves, according to their fathers' households, a lamb for each household. ⁴ Now if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his neighbor nearest to his house are to take one according to the number of persons *in them*; according to what each man should eat, you are to divide the lamb. ⁵ Your lamb shall be an unblemished male a year old; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. ⁶ You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month, then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel is to kill it at twilight. ⁷ Moreover, they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses in which they eat it.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 5:1-8

5 It is actually reported that there is immorality among you, and immorality of such a kind as does not exist even among the Gentiles, that someone has his father's wife. ²You have become arrogant and have not mourned instead, so that the one who had done this deed would be removed from your midst.

³ For I, on my part, though absent in body but present in spirit, have already judged him who has so committed this, as though I were present. ⁴ In the name of our Lord Jesus, when you are assembled, and I with you in spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus, ⁵ I have decided to deliver such a one to Satan for the destruction of his flesh, so that his spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus.

⁶ Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump of dough? ⁷ Clean out the old leaven so that you may be a new lump, just as you are *in fact* unleavened. For Christ our Passover also has been sacrificed. ⁸ Therefore let us celebrate the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Stand Matthew 26:17-30

Now on the first *day* of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Where do You want us to prepare for You to eat the Passover?" ¹⁸ And He said, "Go into the city to a certain man, and say to him, 'The Teacher says, "My time is near; I *am to* keep the Passover at your house with My disciples."" ¹⁹ The disciples did as Jesus had directed them; and they prepared the Passover.

²⁰ Now when evening came, Jesus was reclining *at the table* with the twelve disciples. ²¹ As they were eating, He said, "Truly I say to you that one of you will betray Me." ²² Being deeply grieved, they each one began to say to Him,

"Surely not I, Lord?" ²³ And He answered, "He who dipped his hand with Me in the bowl is the one who will betray Me. ²⁴ The Son of Man *is to* go, just as it is written of Him; but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been good for that man if he had not been born." ²⁵ And Judas, who was betraying Him, said, "Surely it is not I, Rabbi?" Jesus *said to him, "You have said *it* yourself."

²⁶ While they were eating, Jesus took *some* bread, and after a blessing, He broke *it* and gave *it* to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." ²⁷ And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave *it* to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; ²⁸ for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for forgiveness of sins. ²⁹ But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."

STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

Pastor: After the Last Supper, less than twenty-four hours before our Lord

was crucified. Events moved rapidly: prayer in Gethsemane, betrayal by Judas, arrest, mock trial, painful beating, the trudge to Golgotha and execution. Christ's offered body and his shed blood have been given to us in, with, and under the bread and wine in this

holy Mystery.

All: As he was removed from us in the grave, so we remove the

elements and vessels of this holy Sacrament.

Communion vessels are removed.

Pastor: The cross is where Jesus took on our punishment to

be

able to give us the gift of heaven.

All: When John the Baptist saw Jesus, he said, "Behold, the Lamb

of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"

The altar cross is removed.

Pastor: The missal stand holds our worship books that guide our

All: As Jesus suffers, joyous songs are not heard.

The missal stand and Altar Book are removed.

Pastor: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows

me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

All: The events of Golgotha snuffed out the human life of Jesus, the

Light of the world.

All candles are extinguished and removed.

Pastor: Our offerings represent one way of serving God and others. They

reflect God's greatest offering to the world and to us in sending his

Son, Jesus, in human form.

All: As the offered body of Jesus was removed from sight in burial,

so we remove our offerings.

The offerings are removed.

Pastor: The altar is the place where our Lord Jesus serves us as both host

and meal at his banquet feast. The coverings and paraments are made of fine linen and brocade; materials appropriate for feasting

with our King.

All: As our King's body was stripped in crucifixion, so our altar is

stripped of its coverings.

The altar cloths and paraments are removed. After the Stripping of the Altar, the hymn is sung.
