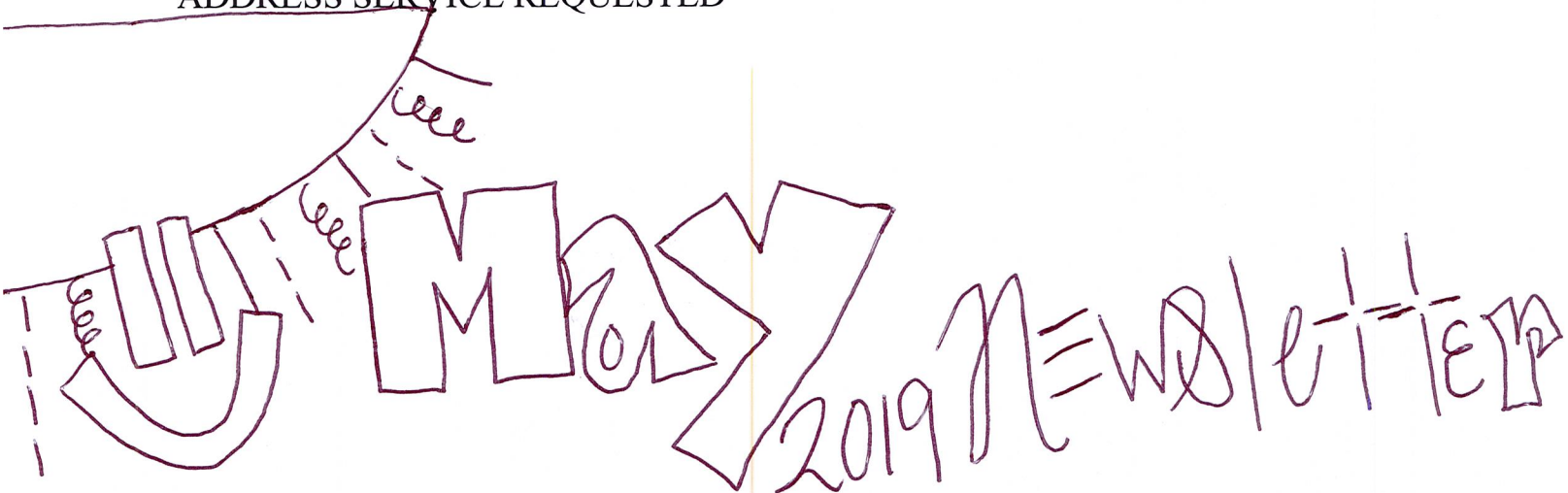

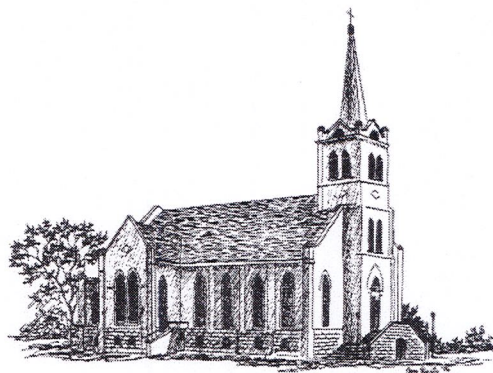

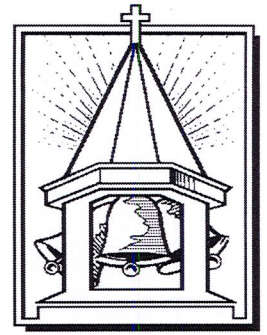

Greetings,

On the 12th of May we will celebrate Mother's Day. While not a "church" holiday, I believe it is an important day in our Christian lives. So often we take mothers for granted, and we may not always think about the many important roles they play in the family, the church and the culture.

According to Wikipedia, Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. Anna's mother was a peace activist who cared for wounded soldiers on both sides of the American Civil War, and had created Mother's Day Work Clubs to address public health issues. Anna wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers, because she believed your mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world."

The U.S. Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday. However, in 1914 Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers, and so it remains.

I, as many others, feel that our mothers deserve much more recognition than they get. Mother's Day is about family (and the nation) honoring mothers and showing gratitude for all that they have given throughout the years of caring for their children.

Unfortunately, like every other holiday it has become commercialized. Anna Jarvis became resentful of this, stating that the emphasis of the holiday was on sentiment, not profit. She argued that people should appreciate and honor their mothers through handwritten letters expressing their love and gratitude, instead of buying gifts and pre-made cards.

Personally, I believe that buying our mother a gift is also out of sentiment. I always purchased a pre-made card while my mother was living. However, I remember that as a child, I always made the cards, and I believe she appreciated them more than the "store-bought" cards.

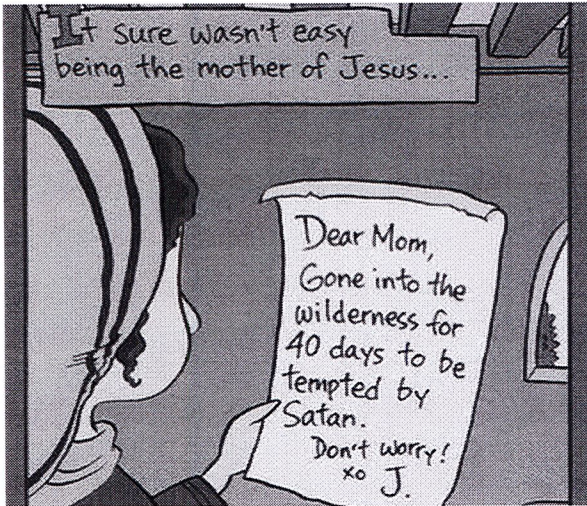

Roth is currently finishing up installing the elevator. Once installed, they can then complete the masonry and will begin installing the metal roof immediately thereafter. Canopy is to be installed in May. The estimated costs for construction, change orders,

March 26, 2019

CALL TO ORDER: President Brian Wendel called the meeting to order. Pastor John opened the meeting with a devotion on patience—be patient, wait and listen.

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Linda Ruschhaupt, 2nd by M'Liss Moore, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Kathy Dunn, 2nd by M'Liss Moore and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

There have been no further communications concerning a burial request by Melody Cooper. Based on the current policies of the cemetery, specific regulations are required for burial privileges in our church's cemetery and this request does not comply with any of the current requirements.

The Property Team, Worship Team and Cemetery Committee are considering meeting to possibly update the property use policy and review the cemetery regulations as well as the wedding policy. Everyone is asked to submit their thoughts on any changes to be addressed by the committees.

Council is asking all members to help bring our membership list up-to-date. Since communion participation and monetary contributions are a basis for membership, the pew cards and envelopes will be brought to the attention of the congregation during the announcements of the church. The bulletins and newsletter will also call attention to these available items.

All convocations are well worth the time and effort required to attend but this is an even more important convocation as we will be electing a new Bishop, so council would encourage anyone interested to prayerfully consider volunteering to attend.

MISSION EVANGELISM TEAM REPORT:

The mission for this month is the NALC Disaster Relief Fund. We had scheduled Water Mission International but because of the urgent need we changed the mission. The flooding in Nebraska and other states in the middle of the country is a disaster. We will make an appeal to the congregation for items needed by the Southern District Disaster Relief warehouse.

It was decided we would have the Ice Cream Social at the opening of Vacation Bible School on June 9, 2019. We discussed an earlier time so there is not so much time between youth leadership training after church and the social. More details later.

We held a planning meeting on Sunday, March 3rd after Church to discuss upcoming events including Easter celebration and VBS. It was well attended and there was good participation. Those attending were Johnny Jank, Brian Wendel, Wanda Hays, Johnna Kethan, Virginia Jank, Joie Caskey, Pastor John Boor, LeAnn Jander, Obert Sagebiel and Kathy Dunn.

We discussed needing a VBS coordinator and volunteers. Joie Caskey is interested in doing this but would need someone else to do the email contacts and other computer tasks. We discussed partnering with the Yorktown Lutheran Church, but Pastor later learned that they already had reached capacity in their buildings. We also discussed using some of our older teens and college age youth to be the teachers at Day Camp. We discussed scheduling at different times.

After exploring some of these, we decided that we would use the Luther Hill Counselors again. Joie Caskey will be the leader and M'Liss Moore will be the contact person. Cathie Bettge and Pam Haun will help coordinate the kitchen. We especially need 16-year old and older youth to assist the Luther Hill Counselors.

Palm Sunday and Easter Planning: Postcards were mailed out March 22nd to our families. We have palm branches for Palm Sunday's Procession. Wendy Bishop is planning the Sunrise Service and Breakfast with the Youth Group. We are hoping to have an expanded Tomb Reenactment Drama. We will still have the Resurrection Egg Hunt but will try to emphasize the real meaning of Easter. Wanda has ordered religious crafts and religious eggs.

The Youth Group is planning a Fishing Tournament and Fish Fry at the Blain Ranch on March 31st.

Creating a Culture of making Sunday School and Church attendance and Jesus the First Priority in our lives: At our

meeting on March 3, we discussed having the Adult Sunday School Class reach out to our families to encourage more attendance. They have received a list of the families and their addresses and phone numbers. Johnna has been calling those who have Baptismal anniversaries with good results. We celebrate these anniversaries the first Sunday of the month with cupcakes and songs.

Sunday School Curriculum: We are using the Sola Curriculum. This is the publishing company sponsored by the NALC. It emphasizes teaching Bible Stories. Sola also produces the "Small Cat" (as in Luther's Small Catechism) series about the sacraments of Baptism, the Lord's Prayer, the 10 Commandments, the Apostles Creed, Holy communion and Confession. We have used this in the past and will continue to use this material periodically. The Parish Ed committee ensures that our curriculum adheres to Luther's teachings of the Bible.

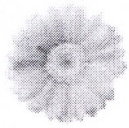

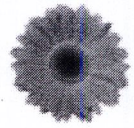
