Confusion of Language

God told the descendants of Noah to be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth with their offspring, but they did not want to separate from one another. Instead, they wanted to build a tower to heaven and make a name for themselves. In order to thwart their plans, God confused their language so they couldn't understand each other, and dispersed them throughout the land.

Genesis 11:1-9 (Page 8, RSV Pew Bible)

¹Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. ²And as people migrated from the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. ³And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. ⁴Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth." 5And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. ⁶And the Lord said, "Behold, they are one people, and they have all one language, and this is only the beginning of what they will do. And nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. ⁷Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech." ⁸So the Lord dispersed them from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. ⁹Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth. And from there the Lord dispersed them over the face of all the earth.

RESPONSIVE READING

My Life Has Been Crushed to the Ground

The psalmist laid out his anguish before the Lord and asked not to be judged too harshly, saying no one is righteous before God. He was pursued and crushed by the enemy; his spirit was broken and in need of God's loving mercy.

Psalm 143 (Page 543-544, RSV Pew Bible) ¹Lord, hear my prayer, and in your faithfulness heed my supplications; answer me in your righteousness.

²Enter not into judgment with your servant, for in your sight shall no one living be justified.

³For my enemy has sought my life; he has crushed me to the ground; he has made me live in dark places like those who are long dead.

⁴My spirit faints within me; my heart within me is desolate.

⁵I remember the time past; I muse upon all your deeds; I consider the works of your hands.

⁶I spread out my hands to you; my soul gasps to you like a thirsty land.

⁷O Lord, make haste to answer me; my spirit fails me; do not hide your face from me or I shall be like those who go down to the Pit.

⁸Let me hear of your loving kindness in the morning, for I put my trust in you; show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you.

⁹Deliver me from my enemies, O Lord, for I flee to you for refuge.

¹⁰Teach me to do what pleases you, for you are my God; let your good Spirit lead me on level ground.

¹¹Revive me, O Lord, for your name's sake; for your righteousness' sake, bring me out of trouble.

¹²Of your goodness, destroy my enemies and bring all my foes to naught for truly I am your servant.

SECOND READING

The Promised Holy Spirit

As the disciples were gathered together in the same house, the fulfillment of Jesus' promised Holy Spirit was realized. The sound of a rushing wind indicated the Spirit's powerful arrival. The entire dwelling was filled with the Spirit, and tongues of fire landed on all who were present. Each one spoke in different languages, yet all could understand each other.

Acts 2:1-21 (Page 948, RSV Pew Bible)

¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, {the apostles} were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. ⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libva belonging to Cyrene. and visitors from Rome, 11both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and

Arabians — we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." 12And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." ¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. ¹⁵For these people are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. ¹⁶But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: 174 And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; ¹⁸even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; ²⁰the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. 21 And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Roth is currently finishing up installing the elevator. Once installed, they can then complete the masonry and will begin installing the metal roof immediately thereafter. Canopy is to be



installed in May. The estimated costs for construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, and incidentals are \$599,553. We are required to pay as construction progresses so the bills are coming in on a regular basis. This project received almost unanimous support so we ask that you prayerfully consider giving generously to this project.
