Distinction Between Righteous and Wicked

The Lord chastised the people for turning away from him and speaking against him, lifting up the wicked and putting God to the test. Then those in the community repented and wrote a book of remembrance before the Lord. God changed his mind and promised to spare the righteous who served him.

(Page 830-831, RSV Pew Bible)

¹³"Your words have been hard against me, says the Lord. But you say, 'How have we spoken against you?' ¹⁴You have said, 'It is vain to serve God. What is the profit of our keeping his charge or of walking as in mourning before the Lord of hosts? ¹⁵And now we call the arrogant blessed. Evildoers not only prosper but they put God to the test and they escape.'' ¹⁶Then those who feared the Lord spoke with one another. The Lord paid attention and heard them, and a book of remembrance was written before him of those who

SECOND READING

The Firstborn of All Creation

St. Paul, in his introduction to his letter to the church in Colossae, describes the uniqueness of Christ, saying he is the image — the very likeness — of the invisible God. Christ is also the "firstborn of all creation," meaning he is the heir of all things, the inheritor of the Father's kingdom, and yet fully One with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

¹³He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. ¹⁵He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. ¹⁶For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities — all things were created through him and for him. ¹⁷And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.





Even though he is still on the ventilator he is able to take nine deep breaths on his own off the ventilator with very little difficulty. He is also able to hold his head on his own for at least sixteen minutes or more. He is getting stronger every day. We pray for continued healing for Cole each and every day. God has been with Cole every step of the way and by faith we know he will continue to do so.

When Cole leaves China he will be going to New Jersey for a surgery on his diaphragm that hopefully will help get him completely off the ventilator. After about one week in New Jersey he will be returning to TIRR in Houston for continued rehab. It will be so great to have him so close to home.

We want to thank each and every one again for all your prayers, concerns and support for Cole and his family while they were in China. They have truly been a blessing. We ask for those continued prayers as Cole and his family continue on this slow and difficult journey. Thank you again and may God bless each and every one.

Christ the King

November 24, 2019

Christ the King Sunday, Proper 29 (Year C)



On this last day of the Church year, we celebrate the kingship of Jesus as we hear of God's impending judgment and the separation of the righteous from the wicked. As he was led toward death, our Savior warned those who mourned that things would get worse before they got better. Moments later, from the cross of his murder, he pronounced a thief forgiven and assured him they would meet in Paradise soon.
