The global unrest we're experiencing, the coronavirus pandemic, the shakiness of our once robust economy certainly causes us to be concerned. But we don't have to feed our fear, let's feed our faith. David said,



Mitchell Jank called the meeting to Order. Pastor John opened the meeting with prayer.

Roth has proposed a partial glass enclosure of the elevator landing. Attached is a copy of the concerns of Property Team presented to Council by Marv Sager and addressed at a called meeting of Church Council March. 11, 2020.

In discussion following the glass enclosure presentation to us (Dickie, Glenn, and Marv) in a meeting at RMA's office, we raised the following concerns:

Appearance (storefront glass look??)

Limited ventilation potentially conducive to formation of mold, mildew, and algae

Maintenance, including glass cleaning

Inability to adequately wash the landing when needed, due to insufficient drainage away from sanctuary and elevator doors

There was a detailed presentation of the renovation project and the many concerns of the Property Team since the standing water problem was discovered on June 26, 2019, followed by uncovering on September 5th, 2019 of the problem with the grade of the landing not being correct, which would cause any water on the landing to drain into the elevator shaft instead of down the steps as it should. Council proceeded to discuss the matter with questions by council members and answers from property team. After a clearer picture of the current status of the ongoing project, the council decided to reject the March 6 proposal from Roth on their fix for the water collection on the

landing at the elevator. Motion was made by Johnny Jank, seconded by Linda Ruschhaupt and passed by members of council present to reject the March 6 proposal. A motion was also made by Marv Sager to engage legal counsel for satisfactory completion of the project if Property Team deems necessary. Motion was seconded by M'Liss Moore and passed by all members present.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

ADDITIONAL COUNCIL BUSINESS MARCH 18, 2020

Worship team met March 17, 2020, and one of their items of concern was whether to continue church services at St John in light of the Corona Virus pandemic. The final decision was to continue with services until further developments are confirmed in our area. On Wednesday March 18, 2020, Mitchell Jank, presiding president, called the members of council with concerns due to a confirmed case of the virus in DeWitt county. Due to this news and there being a scheduled mid-week Lenten service that night, a telephone poll was taken of the members of council and it was decided to cancel the Wednesday night Lenten service and suspend Sunday services until further notice.


