Greetings,

"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." (Hebrews 11:1) Hope is the trusting expectation that God will keep His Word. Faith is believing that word, trusting God and then acting on that. I think what that means in the midst of what we are going through right now is to believe three things and then respond. What we need to believe is, 1. God is aware; 2. God cares; and 3. God protects. Then we need to respond to that belief.

God is aware. The current pandemic did not catch God by surprise. God was aware it was going to happen long before it was created. David wrote about pestilence and plague thousands of years ago to encourage and comfort us. God is in Control. Romans 8:28 tells us; "28 And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.

This doesn't mean that we shouldn't take this pandemic seriously. We should take the recommended steps to protect ourselves and others. But there is no need to give into fear, terror or panic. Psalm 91 says, "A thousand may fall to the right and ten thousand to our right – but we need not fear. We can put our trust in God."

We should all know that God cares. I assure you, God has not forgotten or forsaken you. Peter wrote, "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7) I have experienced so many wonderful answers to prayer through the years; I have seen and experienced the miracles time and again. It tells me that God cares. He cares for me and He cares for you.

The Lord said to Moses, "Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live." So Moses made a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, they lived." (Numbers 10:4-9)

There are a number of things that strike me about this story. One is that it was actually an act of love from God to turn the people to Him; secondly, God used the plague for good; thirdly, God had Moses make an idol of a despised snake to be their salvation

God will protect you, as He did these people, if you look to Him for help and healing and hope. God is aware of what you are going through; God cares what you are going through; and God will protect you as well.

Trust God. Believe Him. Trust Him. Place your faith in Him. This coronavirus plague is an opportunity for growth and spiritual maturing. We are so blessed. The whole world is shaken by this pandemic. Will you react in fear or faith? Again, I'm not saying to take this lightly or foolishly. We don't need to live in fear, but be cautious. Be wise. But remember, 1. God is Aware; 2. God Cares; 3. God Protects, and finally, Trust Him.



April 28, 2020

MEMBERS PRESENT: Pastor John Boor, Mitchell Jank, vice president presiding in the absence of a president, Virginia Jank (Secretary) Archie Abrameit (Treasurer) M'Liss Moore (Financial Secretary) Glenn Ruschhaupt (Finance) Linda Ruschhaupt (Mission and Evangelism) Beverly Bodden (Parish Life) Laurie Pokluda (Parish Ed) Marv Sager (Property) Johnny Jank (Worship)

CALL TO ORDER: Mitchell Jank called the meeting to order. M'Liss Moore opened the meeting with a devotion on "God's Promises to You".

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Marv Sager, 2nd by Beverly Bodden, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Glenn Ruschhaupt, 2nd by Johnny Jank, and approved.

Old Business: Signature cards are in the process of being updated. TDECU and Wells Fargo need to be contacted to see if everything is in order as for as authorized signers on their accounts.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Brenda and I are living in our new home. We moved the main items last Friday and are moving everything else as we can.

We need to discuss how we are doing "church". I have had many good comments about our recording church and posting online. There were also several good comments about drive in church. Here are the new guidelines that Governor Abbott gave yesterday.

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott detailed plans on Monday to reopen the state for business amid the <u>coronavirus pandemic</u> – allowing places like retail stores, restaurants and movie theaters to open up to customers at a limited capacity by Friday May 1.

Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick said wearing masks will be encouraged but will not be required. The move by Abbot puts Texas – the country's second-largest

economy behind California - at the forefront of the movement to reopen state economies that have been basically brought to a standstill as the U.S. grapples with the outbreak of COVID-19. "We're not just going to pen up and hope for the best," Abbott said during a news conference on Monday in Austin. "We're going to open in a way that will also contain the virus and keep us safe." He added: "A more strategic approach is required so that we don't open only to close down again." Along with retail stores, restaurants and movie theaters, Abbott said that museums and libraries can also reopen on Friday at a 25 percent capacity. Sole proprietors of businesses can also open and doctors and dentists can resume normal operations as well. Abbott added that hospitals will still have to keep 50 percent of their capacity for patients suffering from Churches and places of worship, COVID-19. which were allowed to remain open during the state's stay-at-home orders, are also allowed to expand their capacity provided safe social distancing measures are still enacted. shops, hair salons and bars will still remain closed.

FINANCE TEAM REPORT

There was no meeting this month.

MISSION EVANGELISM TEAM REPORT

The mission committee did not meet again this month because of the COVID-19. We did choose a mission for the month of May via telephone text and email. The mission we chose was Samaritans Purse COVID-19 Response.

This mission set up tents in many countries of the world including hard-hit Italy and our own country the good old USA. Their tents were in New York City and other major cities that were hit hard in the US. The tents contain life-saving medical equipment and personnel to manage them.

PARISH LIFE TEAM REPORT

Memorial Day Services were discussed. As of right now, services will remain the drive-in type. Confirmation Day is being discussed. Confirmation class is near completion, with the study of communion still pending.

PARISH ED TEAM REPORT

It was reported that packets were sent out to our Sunday School students for Easter Sunday. A ZOOM class was also held in an effort to engage our students during the coronavirus epidemic. The Sunday School staff also received word from the Luther Hill group that was supposed to conduct VBS at St John this year. They have decided not to come because of the coronavirus situation and have offered to refund the monies already forwarded to them for this event. Discussion was held on having Sunday school student pictures appear on any online media such as facebook and it was decided that the parents should be contacted to receive permission from them of any pictures of their children which may be used on any public data forums.

PROPERTY TEAM REPORT

Regular Meeting scheduled for April 12th was postponed for Easter Sunday and in anticipation of need for called meeting(s) following notice of Council decision to decline the Roth Construction proposal to glass in portions of the elevator landing area.

Ongoing Maintenance Items:

Discussions regarding the need and objectives for a general workday have been suspended pending ongoing developments related to COVID-19.

Items Complete:

- GVEC replaced light bulbs in exterior fixtures for which they are responsible
- Moon contacted for AC inspections
- Bathroom and kitchen supplies replenished
- New computer ordered for church office
- New card for sign repair ordered
- Formal demand letter sent to Roth Construction

Renovation Progress:

Team members (Dickie, Glenn, Pastor John, and Marv) met at the church on Saturday (April 25th) to review plan for infill and grading in preparation for planting grass in the construction area, along with review of outstanding punch list items, etc. Grade work and topsoil placement is tentatively planned for early May, with grass planting to follow.

On Sunday (April 26th) afternoon the same group met with Patrick Ohrt to review punch list progress by Roth Construction. Patrick documented outstanding issues and committed to prepare an updated punch list for our review and subsequent submission to Roth Construction. The meeting also involved lengthy discussion regarding pending resolution of the elevation and grading issue with the landing, as well as resolution of the flatwork ponding issue.

Discussions with Roth Construction, along with RMA involvement, will continue to be ongoing in efforts to mutually resolve these two key issues, along with numerous less significant punch list items.

Next Regularly Scheduled Meeting – To Be Determined

WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Worship Team last met on the 17th of March just before all this craziness began. With all that has happened since then it seems hard to imagine that was only a little over a month ago. Although we have not met together as a Team, we have made several decisions regarding worship under these different circumstances. This is an attempt to bring everyone up to date.

The Sunday after Worship Team met. services were canceled and then with the help of the Sunday school youth group, we recorded the contemporary Lenten service for watching as the service on the 29th of March. This led us to attempt to get the services to the people via a "previously recorded" service that was then uploaded to YouTube. The Link to that YouTube video was then posted on the St John website and Face Book page for viewing at our member's convenience. The first Sunday, 5th of April, we accomplished this with only a few "hiccups". The following Sunday, being Easter Sunday, we wanted to try in some way to offer Holy Communion in addition to the recorded service. The council was polled on whether this could be a way to get communion to those wanting it, especially on Easter Sunday. A majority thought it could be an acceptable way to accomplish it, but there were some who voiced concerns about the whole idea of the delivery and the service. We completed a "drive up" communion service with

approximately 80 people receiving communion. April 19th we again recorded the service and posted it. Last Sunday, 26th of April would have traditionally been Grave Decoration Sunday at St John, with Church under the trees. So again, in an attempt to have a service "under the trees", we used a transmitter to hold the service outside in front of the cemetery and broadcast it over a FM signal to member's vehicle radios. The service was not without its challenges. We couldn't really publish the "parking lot service" until we were sure we could get the transmitter and make it work, and then there were other recording issues. But again, there was some limited success with about 22 vehicles and approximately 70 people attendance.

Now there seems to be moves to allow opening churches back up for services. This also will come with its own set of challenges. Disinfecting the sanctuary, distancing or assigned seating, all attendees being masked, still needing to get the service to those with higher risk factors and others unable to attend. As the landscape of dealing with the Covid-19 changes, we will need to be ready to change to continue to connect with our congregation in ways we maybe haven't thought of yet. The other challenge with all this "thinking outside of the box" will be trying to balance our new connectivity with those members who just long for the Sunday they can sit in "their pew" and take part in a service "like we used to before all this virus stuff started".

DISCUSSION: A major concern of not being able to get to our members who do not have access to internet, Facebook or YouTube was presented to the council. This discussion led to what it will take to reopen our church doors and conduct services as done before this epidemic. The council was made aware of precautions which will need to be taken to keep our parishioners safe and heathy: 1. Having two services—one for the under 65 group and one for the over 65 group with disinfecting of the church between services 2 Temperatures being taken before anyone can enter the church 3. Not being able to pass offering plates from person to person in the pews 4. Hand sanitizing stations in

the church 5. Using every other pew for social distancing suggestions.

Worship committee leader, Johnny Jank, noted that the worship team will be re-evaluating this situation every couple of weeks and use CDC and Governor Abbot's guidelines for safe and heathy re-opening of our church sanctuary for our members. At the present time recordings of service will be made of the Sunday services and posted on the St John website on YouTube.

Other New Business:

John and Kate Mueller have requested burial plots in the St. John Cemetery. Council was made aware of the \$500/plot charge for these plots. Laurie Pokluda made a motion to approve the purchase of the plots, Linda Ruschhaupt seconded the motion, and it was passed by council.

It was brought to the attention of council members that no one has volunteered to have the opening devotions for June and November of 2020. These spots were offered to the new members of council, and Archie Abrameit volunteered for June and Laurie Pokluda volunteered for the November opening devotion.

A "thank you" note from the Boys and Girls club was presented at the meeting and it was shared that the NALC Women's Gathering has been cancelled at this time.

There being no further business, the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
