In some areas they actually have to teach the people to read first, then teach them the Word so they can't just translate and move on they have to stay till the people can teach their own the way of our Lord.

Over one Billion people in the world still do not have a Bible in their language. An estimated 165 million people do not have a single bible verse of Scripture.

They have translated the Bible in 70 languages and have impacted 20 million people.

For seven straight years they have maintained a four star rating with Charity Navigator. Only 4% of their total budget goes to overhead expenses.


