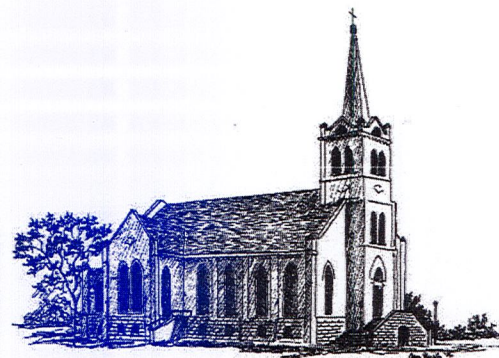

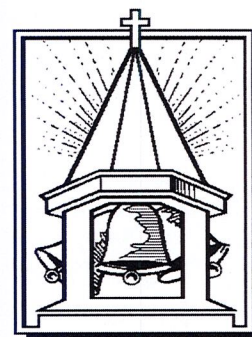

I would like to thank all of our members and our council who contribute so much time and effort into our church and our ministries.

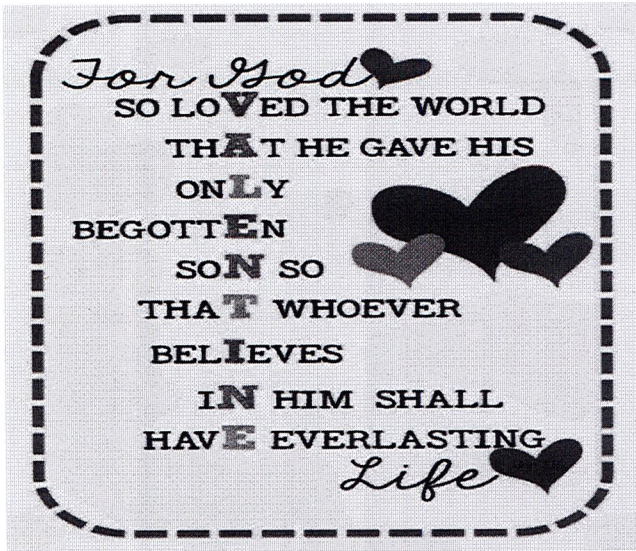

Tunnel to Towers Foundation

Tunnel to Towers Mission Statement

The mission of Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation is to honor the sacrifice of firefighter Stephen Siller, who laid down his life to save others on September 11, 2001. We also honor our military and first responders who continue to make the supreme sacrifice of life and limb for our country.

Since the time the organization began, it has kept overhead expenses low so that the maximum percentage of donor's contributions are used to help our American heroes. For the last few years over 93% of fundraising dollars went toward Foundation programs. Frank Siller, CEO and Chairman, offers his uncompensated time.

Fifty four mortgage free homes were provided through 3 major programs in 2019: the Gold Star Home Program, Fallen First Responder Home Program, and Smart Home Program.

Through the *Fallen First Responder Home Program*, Tunnel to Towers aims to pay off the mortgages of fallen law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty that leave behind young children. The Foundation's goal is to ensure stability and security to these families facing sudden, tragic loss.

The *Gold Star Family Home Program*, launched in September 2018, honors the legacy of those who made the ultimate sacrifice while serving our country. The Foundation will provide a mortgage-free home to surviving spouses with young children.

The Tunnel to Towers Foundation builds mortgage-free *smart homes* for our most catastrophically injured veterans and first responders. Each home is designed to address the unique needs of each individual. *Smart homes* host a myriad of features such as automated doors and lighting, wider halls and doorways, special showers to accommodate wheelchairs, automatic door openers, cabinets, counters, and stove tops that can be raised and lowered, back-up generators, and central heating and air conditioning systems that can be controlled by tablets. These homes help our most severely injured veterans and first responders to reclaim their day-to-day independence.



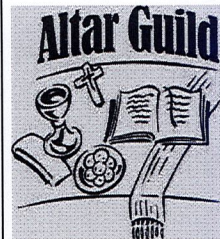
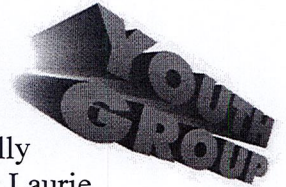
HOLY BAPTISM

Worship Team Notes

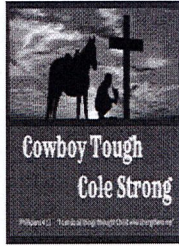

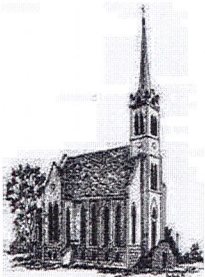

December 22, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: Mitchell Jank called the meeting to order. Marv Sager opened the meeting with a devotion "The Giver of the Gift" based on Romans 8:32. God gave us Jesus Christ.

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Archie Abrameit, 2nd by Marv Sager, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Johnny Jank, 2nd by Linda Ruschhaupt and approved.

The audit committee consisting of Brenda Gohmert, John Lloyd Gohmert and one other member of the congregation will meet to go over the church's books before the annual meeting.

PASTOR'S REPORT

On Christmas Eve it has been decided to have everyone on the east side of the sanctuary wear their masks during the entire service. This is in response to a member that wanted to be inside on Christmas Eve but did not feel comfortable without everyone wearing masks.

Renovation Progress:

Dickie and Marv met with Ray Reese and Errol Dietze on December 2nd. Discussions remain ongoing in efforts to resolve construction errors related to elevation/grade on the elevator landing, ponding on the elevator approach flatwork, and cracks in the drop-off slab concrete, along with remaining unaddressed Punch List items.

Approximate Renovation Fund Donations to Date - \$570,000

Next regularly scheduled meeting is January 10th, 2021 at 8:00 AM

DISCUSSION: Tom Lodeweges has been filling in the cracks in the windows on the Sanctuary wall. He will be taking a break to wait for warmer conditions to allow the filling to set better. Sometime in January, Victoria Air will be evaluating the air duct work and possibly

suggesting replacing the A/C units with smaller ones. There is a problem with the elevator door closing properly. The company is not able to come down and fix the problem at this time. There is a manual fix. Someone just needs to be present when the elevator is in use.

WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

Dec.17, 2020

Those present: Pastor John, Beverly Bodden, Candace Cowley, Virginia Jank, Carol Ann Sagebiel, Marv Sager, Norrean Sager, Bruce Weise. The team also welcomed Brenda Gohmert as a new member of our team.

Services are going good with the ability to attend church in the sanctuary, in the vehicle in the parking lot, and on-line via YouTube or St. John's website. Everyone thanked Johnny Jank for the work he has been doing to get these things accomplished. They also thanked Brenda Boor, Virginia Jank and Trish Hood for their help in leading the songs during the services.

Members of the committee were made aware of the role Sarah has been playing to get our Lectionary Readers, and readers for the Advent Wreath Readings. Thank you, Sarah.

Discussion on the Organ: Replacement of the particle board will probably cost around \$10,000. The last time the organ was overhauled was in 1987. Digital control components are an option for us to consider in the future. Shawn Sanders of Pipe Organ Technician, who is currently maintaining our organ, has put in one that is 15 years trouble free to date and a warranty on work like this would be 10 years. Marv suggested that Council be made aware of the condition of the organ and Shawn's suggestions. The Council may then put together a committee to investigate our possibilities in replacement of the organ and report findings back to Council for consideration. **This is a Church Council action item recommended by the Team.** Returning to communion on the 1st and 3rd Sunday communion was discussed. It was suggested that we continue with 1st Sunday only and reconsider this when we meet in February and see where the COVID-19 situation is at that time.

It was suggested that members be reminded of the importance of wearing masks during church. It has

been suggested that the church be divided into sections, maybe one side of the church for those that wear masks and the other side for those who would rather not wear their masks during the service. The members present decided that if this made more people feel comfortable coming into the sanctuary, this would be an option. It was decided to suggest Council implementation of this division during the Christmas services at 3:00 and 10:00 on December 24, since a lot of people would want to attend church for Christmas services, and this might allow them to feel more comfortable.

This is a Church Council action item recommended by the Team.

There being no additional discussion the Team selected hymns for the services through the 14th of February.

DISCUSSION: Explanation of the organ suggestions: The particle board structure is what holds the various pipes in place. It is not falling apart currently but if the organ is going to be upgraded it would be wise to replace these housings at this time. This part alone might add approximately \$10,000 to the overall organ repair and upgrade using digital parts, and the particle board should be replaced for sturdiness. It is the consensus of the worship team that a committee should be established to consider the suggestions of Shawn Sanders or do something else. It would be the suggestion that the committee consist of Bruce Weise, a council member, a member of worship team, a member of property team, one younger voting member of the congregation and one senior member of the congregation. There may be a need to have someone else evaluate the organ. Suggestions from the congregation will be welcomed. Johnny Jank made a motion to form a committee to investigate and collect information on the pipe organ so that we can develop a plan to address the deficiencies of our current organ and what should be done going forward. Glenn Ruschhaupt seconded the motion and the motion passed by the members present.

The Council commended all of the children who participated and the folks that helped make our "Bethlehem Village" a success.

Glenn Ruschhaupt made a motion to strongly recommend that anytime persons cannot be 6 feet apart and not with a member of their household, they should wear a mask. Linda Ruschhaupt seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-2 with 2 abstaining noting that we do have a policy in force strongly recommending we use hand sanitizer and wear a mask. It was stated that the letter be sent out again to remind members of our congregation of our policy and guidelines and that the guidelines are also on our website.

January 24, 2021 will be the date for the Annual Congregational Meeting. Annual reports from committees should be submitted to the church office by January 10, 2021 for printing in the Annual Report for the meeting. January 31, 2021 has been set as Installation Sunday for the new council members.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


