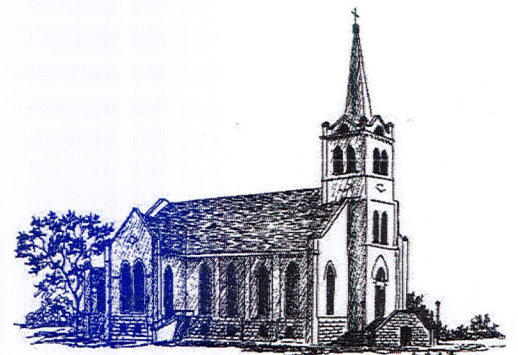

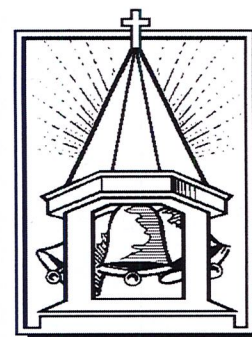

Greetings

We are all youth. As youth, we encounter the culture of society that continues to **redefine** sin as something more acceptable to secular eyes. We need to keep God's Word close to remain true to His wisdom.

Being youthful, we are surrounded by a world that we don't always understand and don't always agree with the guidelines that God has set down in scripture. Society today defines terms differently than God. This is a problem because we don't always recognize the dangers around us. In today's world moral absolutes are not accepted, where truth is relative to our position rather than a bedrock fact we can rely on. We regularly find sin being redefined as something else, something more acceptable, something more explainable, something less offensive. None of like being told that what we are doing is wrong. Even if that accusation is coming from God himself.

Look at the things that have become not only common place, but acceptable to a world that has moved away from a moral standard. Teen pregnancy continues to be on the rise. Single parent households are normal today, rather than the exception. Drug use is at epidemic levels. Lying, stealing, and cheating are considered acceptable rules and norms for business deals. Hurting others, abortion, and even under is found to be justifiable and acceptable ways of dealing with problems. It seems like the moral standard that was useful to us in past generations, has become outdated.

Society has lost sight of the standard that God set for us. Instead, He's been replaced with a secular, moral framework where nothing can be called morally right or morally wrong. The attitude today seems to be to do your own thing, invent your own standard, and choose how you will lie your own life. Society tells us we should never call anyone wrong because that's just not nice, and we shouldn't offend anyone.

Rather than seeking out a standard to follow, people are looking to validate the way they choose to be, rather than looking toward the image that God created man to be. People are looking for others to say, "you're okay, just the way you are".

Instead of condemning bad behavior as sin, society repeatedly refuses to accept a moral standard of their chosen actions. We are at war against any standard that God has erected. We need to remember that God has placed a standard in our hands that shows us what sin is. We must accept sin for what it is, disobedience to His will.

When it comes to repentance, and storing up God's Word in our heart, David had it right. Keeping God's word in our hearts is the surest way to stay true to his will. We live in a world where temptations will always be present, a world where sin is ever present and always finding new ways to move away from the standard that God has laid out for us. We need to be prepared as the world redefines sin to sound acceptable, even though it's not what God intended. Reaching out for that sinful desire is not what God wanted us to do. Instead, he wanted us to repent and turn away from our sinful past, so that we can enjoy the gifts of forgiveness that He sacrificed so much to offer for our salvation. Ultimately, its God's standard that is the one and only thing that we can rely on no matter what.

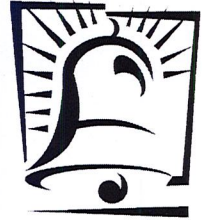

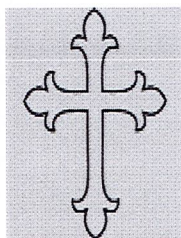

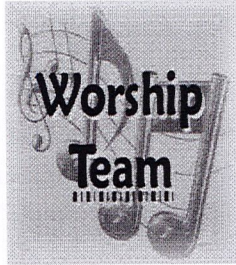

Worship Team Notes

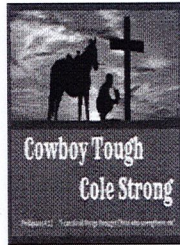

Tax Tips for Traditional IRA Owners

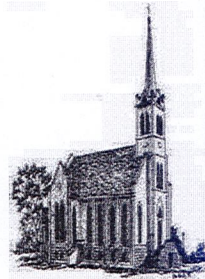


If you have a traditional IRA and you are 70 ½ years old and older, you are required to take a RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) annually.

There is a provision in the regulations that allow you to have this distribution made directly to a qualifying non-profit (church, etc.) and not be liable for income taxes on that amount.

CALL TO ORDER: Obert Sagebiel called the meeting to order. He also opened the meeting with a devotion calling for Prayer for our country's leaders.

MINUTES: Reviewed, Motion to accept by Marv Sager, 2nd by Mitchell Jank, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, Motion to accept by M'Liss Moore, 2nd by Johnna Picard and approved.

DISCUSSION: OLD BUSINESS: Council members discussed the establishment of an organ committee to start collecting information concerning the church's organ. There is some discussion regarding Lenten

Services. Should we have the midweek services or not. Last year we did not. If we do have them should we forego the imposition of ashes. There has been discussion on the NALC clergy connect page about the health risks. There has been a wide range of ideas, but most are not feasible. This is a subject we need to discuss.

I am leading a New Members class and we have 8 people attending. We will be formally receiving them sometime in February.

DISCUSSION: Council members present discussed having Ash Wednesday and Lenten services during the COVID-19 pandemic. Imposition of ashes and communion were topics of discussion. Motion was made by Virginia Jank that we have Ash Wednesday services with Communion but without imposition of ashes, and that we dispense with the Wednesday night Lenten services for this year. If we do have VBS, it might be a good idea to postpone it until closer to the beginning of school. Another idea, was to contact area churches and see what they are doing and if they might be interested in partnering with us and have a joint VBS.

Johnna stated that the youth group is working on a quilt, with each square representing a "challenge" the class did that week. She suggested that the group would possibly like to lead the 4th Sunday in April service and have a presentation of the quilt at that time.

- Victoria AC evaluation and suggested repair of current heating and AC system
- Parsonage inspection, AC duct work, and deep cleaning:
- Pending removal of remaining items from parsonage

Renovation Progress:

Dickie, Glenn, and Marv met with Ray Reese and Errol Dietze on January 8th. Discussions remain ongoing in efforts to resolve construction errors related to elevation/grade on the elevator landing, ponding on the elevator approach flatwork, and cracks in the drop-off slab concrete, along with remaining unaddressed Punch List items. A non-binding mediation meeting is tentatively scheduled for early February in offices of Dietze and Reese.

Approximate Renovation Fund Donations To Date - \$580,000

Next regularly scheduled meeting is February 14th, 2021 at 8:00 AM

DISCUSSION: Home Elevators was called to service the elevator. They have informed the church that they are unable to perform services on the elevator until they receive payment of the balance, they say is still owed them by the general contractor. Property Team is pursuing the possibility of a non-binding mediation meeting with the general contractor, along with applicable legal counsel, to discuss options for correction of construction errors, addressing elevator functionality issues, and resolution of remaining punch list items.

WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

Worship Team did not have a meeting this month.

ADDITIONAL Discussion: President, Obert Sagebiel had a short presentation on “Lutherans for Life”. This group stands against abortion and is involved in concerns for the elderly. The group is looking to start a Texas Branch in the area. Obert has contact information for anyone who may be called to look into “Lutherans for Life” and possibly attend meetings to get the community informed of their mission. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with the Lord’s Prayer.

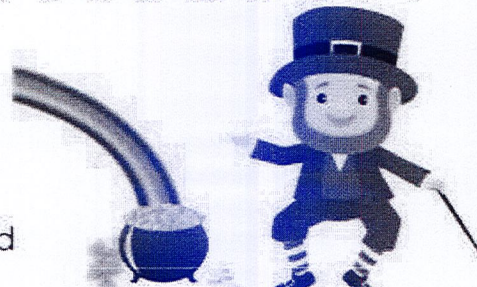
