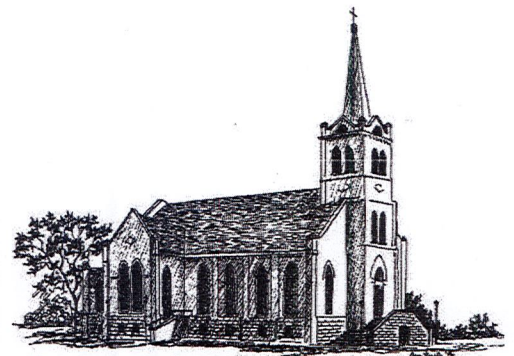

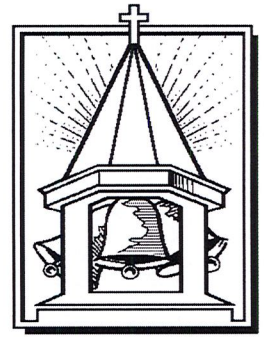

Greetings,

I have received many inquiries about a letter that was recently sent to members who were not active. I want to stress that the letter was sent to comply with the church constitution.

For some time now the Church Council has attempted to tackle the issue of the Church's membership roster. It was decided 2 years ago at the March 2019 meeting to make an effort to reach out to all members on the rolls, inform them of their status, and then encourage them to be more active in their church life or aid them in moving their membership to where they already may be actively worshipping.

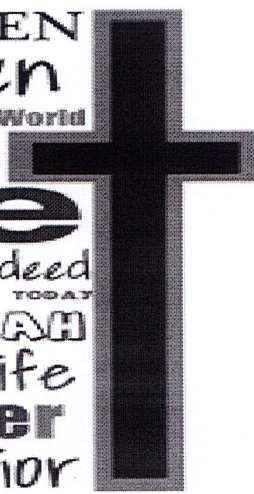
The church's constitution has a very simple formula for keeping a membership active. One must attend worship, partake in Holy Communion, and make a monetary donation in each calendar year. These three actions allow one to be an active member and share in all the benefits, including voting rights, burial privileges and others. Research was completed, a letter was composed and mailed to let those members know whose records indicated they had not met the minimum guidelines.

This letter was not an attempt to separate anyone from membership, but rather a call out to say, "We want you back. We enjoy your presence worshipping with us! What can we do to bring you back?" If however you have found another flock that meets your worship needs, how can we assist you in getting your membership transferred. We hope the later is not the case and the letter would just be a reminder to bring one back to full membership here at St. John. If you have received a letter and have any questions or concerns please contact myself (**Pastor John**), an Evangelism Team or any Council member. Thank you.

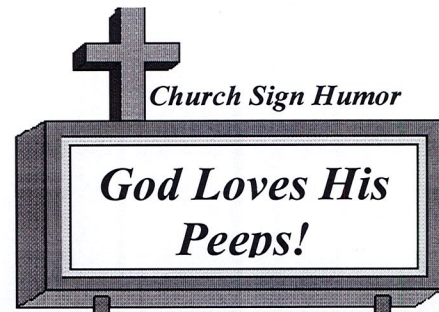
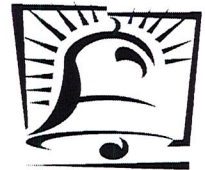

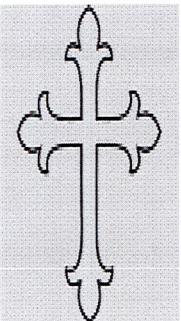


Water Missions – Disaster Response Texas Winter Storm

Mission Statement

We will specifically designate funds to go toward the Disaster Response: Texas Winter Storm. The week of freezing temperatures and severe power outages led to a plumbing catastrophe due to burst pipes. This resulted in approximately 14 million people being left without safe drinking water.

Water Mission collaborated with Plumbers Without Borders to get safe water back into the homes of the most vulnerable. They are working to stock the Austin Disaster Relief Network's warehouse with a plumbing depot so ADRN is able to continue serving where there is a need.

There will be a called congregational meeting following worship on Sunday, April 11th in the Sanctuary. This meeting will be regarding the air conditioner unit that needs to be replaced.

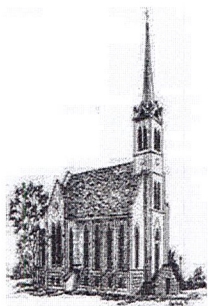
Please Help

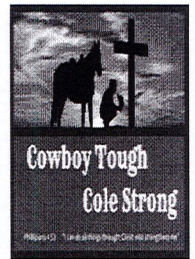

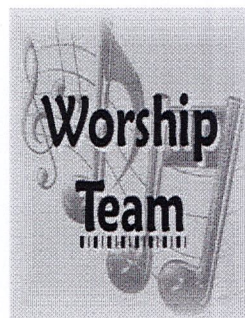

CALL TO ORDER: Obert called the meeting to order.

OPENING DEVOTION: Johnna read a passage on obedience.

MINUTES: Reviewed, motion to accept by Marv, seconded by Charles, and approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Reviewed, motion to accept by Beverly, seconded by Cathie, and approved.

Pastor Report

The NALC is having a Pastor Conference in San Antonio May 4-6. The theme of the conference is "Keeping the Main Things the Main Things." I would like to attend and ask that the church pay for the costs. The cost of the seminar is \$75 and the hotel rooms are \$132 per night.

Parish Ed Committee Meeting Minutes

Date: Sunday February 6th 8:00 am

Agenda Item 1: Sunrise Service for Easter Sunday Morning – It was discussed and decided on to have the Sunrise service as usual. Changes suggested and agreed on were to move the service outside, weather permitting, or in the main sanctuary, if bad weather, to provide more space for attendees. It was also agreed on to do the breakfast after the Sunrise service. Feather Diebel was not in attendance, so Johnna called her during the week to discuss the Youth Group's involvement in the Sunrise service. Johnna will continue to work with Feather and others to help get ready for the service.

Agenda Item 2: Youth Service 4th Sunday in April – It was discussed that the Worship Team Committee did approve the Youth Service for the 4th Sunday in April. Johnna will work with her Sunday school class to get all materials, Powerpoint slides, songs ready for the service.

Agenda Item 3: Vacation Bible School – Three ideas were discussed about Vacation Bible School. The first idea was to partner with a neighboring church to work together for Vacation Bible School. Johnna had called the Ander Luther Church and the Yorktown Lutheran Church the week prior and discovered that their churches were not going to work with a lot of outside congregations to keep their attendance numbers smaller in light of COVID concerns. It was

agreed not to try to partner with other churches. Idea number two was to hire Luther Hill councilors to come help with Vacation Bible School. Various concerns were discussed such as unsure of quality of councilors, length of time the councilors are available, and the possibility of Luther Hill canceling like they did last year. So, it was decided not to hire the Luther Hill councilors. The third idea was to recruit enough volunteers to manage Vacation Bible School on our own. Laurie and Trish are going to work together to get enough youth leaders for the groups. It was also decided to buy the Luther Hill curriculum for \$250, which Johnna had Sara purchase that week. A date for Vacation Bible School was set for August 2 – 6. Other activities regarding the Sundays before and after were discussed with nothing finalized. Anyone who wants to help or volunteer for this event will be greatly appreciated and reach out to myself, Trish, or Laurie.

Renovation Progress:

Discussions remain ongoing regarding efforts to resolve construction errors related to elevation/grade on the elevator landing, ponding on the elevator approach flatwork, and cracks in the drop-off slab concrete, along with remaining unaddressed Punch List items. Property Team is still pursuing the previously mentioned non-binding mediation meeting subject to applicable attorney and general contractor management availability.

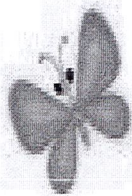
