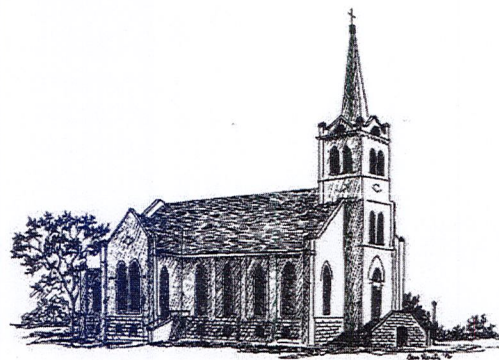

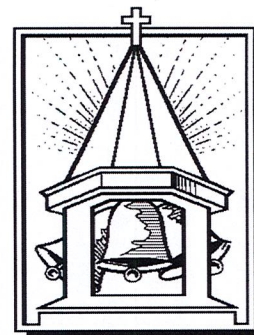

Greetings,

100 years ago, the members of St. John Ev. Lutheran Church here in Meyersville stepped out in faith that God would provide and endeavored to build a new sanctuary. I am sure that the members engaged in much prayer and discussion about the decision.

It is to the glory of God that the congregation had grown to the point they needed a larger sanctuary. But the congregation had to give thought to how much larger would it grow and how to pay for it.

They were obviously blessed and through prayer and wisdom given by God they made the decision to build our current sanctuary that has served the community for 100 years. It was no small undertaking and the members took it upon themselves to build the sanctuary themselves while at the same time maintaining their own ranches and families.

The congregation built the current sanctuary in 19 months. We need to remember that they didn't have all of the technology and machinery available to them that we have today. They dug the basement with horse drawn shovels and had to make many of their own materials. To build this structure in 19 months would be a challenge even today.

On July 18th we will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of the completion of our current sanctuary. We will have speakers to relate to us some of the upgrades that have been completed over the years to maintain and improve the sanctuary.

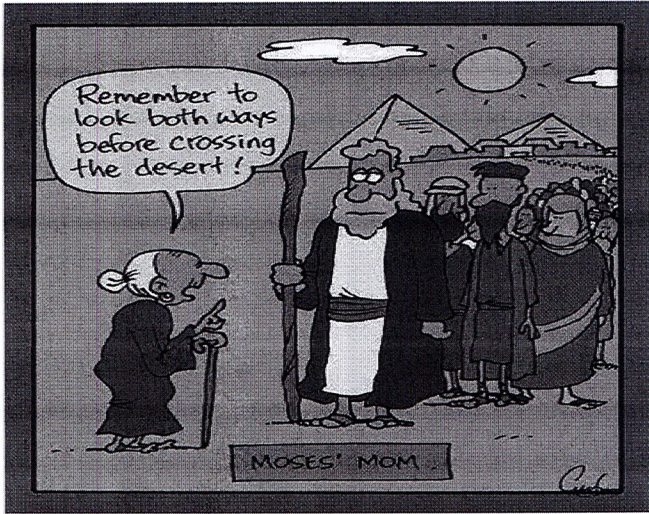
We will have a modified service with a baptism and Holy communion. We will also have a luncheon after the service so we may gather together and share fellowship as they undoubtedly did 100 years ago.

It is a tribute to God that St. John has regularly proclaimed God's word for over 170 years. It is also a tribute to the members of St. John for having faith that God would provide for the congregation and bless us with members that are in a relationship with our Lord and Savior and have shared the Good News of Jesus Christ with others in the community.

Renovation Update

Remaining items for the construction progress are to correct construction errors related to landing elevation and drainage, modification of steps

to meet original architectural plans, and elimination of flatwork ponding on approach to elevator, at contractor's cost. After completion, a final walk through will be held to address any items that need to be touched up. The current invoiced total for cost of construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, grass planting, and incidentals is \$600,850.80. Designated giving and memorials received to date total \$597,218.30.

Worship Team Notes

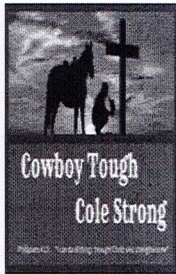
We will be having church in the sanctuary at 10:15 a.m. from now on, unless something changes. Communion will go

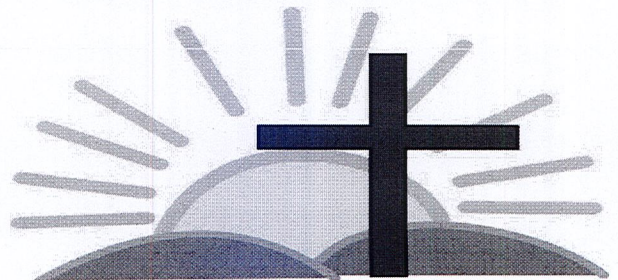
