

Greetings,

We are approaching All Saints Sunday. The Christian festival of All Saints Day relates to giving God earnest gratitude for the lives and deaths of His saints. At St. John we celebrate the lives of the saints we have lost and recognize those we have lost in the past year. But additionally, we also celebrate all the saints throughout Christian history.

"All Saints Day" annually reminds us of our connection to all Christians. I have been asked who are saints? The Bible teaches us that all Christians are saints. Scripture tells us that anyone who trusts in Christ alone for salvation is a Saint.

Sainthood is granted by God Himself to any common, salt-of-the-earth person who simply trusts Christ. (1 Corinthians 1:2) It isn't because people are special in and of themselves that we call them saints, but it is because they are ordinary, everyday people who allow the Holy Spirit to work through them, doing the deeds of the Lord.

The gospel message is that God the Son came to earth, lived a perfectly obedient life, died on the cross to pay for our sin, and rose again proving His atoning work was complete. Saints are those who realize that they can't please God solely by their good deeds, but rather trust Christ alone. Scripture says that a person of faith actually becomes the very righteousness of God.

It is also a day when Christians give thanks for the presence of the Holy Spirit in their lives and in the lives of all people.

Martin Luther wrote, "The Holy Scriptures call Christians saints and the people of God. To forget that we are saints is to forget Christ and to forget our baptism."

Through faith we become united to Christ and are saved from God's judgment as well as from the futile way of life that we naturally follow (1 Peter 3:18).

All Saints Sunday is a very special day in the Church Calendar. As we celebrate All Saints Sunday this year remember all of the saints in history that have gone before us. It is truly a day to celebrate, and remember that we are Saints in God's eyes.

Worship services will be in the church sanctuary at 10:15 a.m. Communion will go back to the 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month by



cost. After completion, a final walk through will be held to address any items that need to be touched up. The current invoiced total for cost of construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, grass planting, and incidentals is \$600,850.80.
