

We have entered into a time when rational thinking, reasonableness, honesty, truth, and even humility is considered substandard; considered to be the enemy of progressiveness, seen as distasteful even. We live in a time where feelings, where emotions, where personal opinions trump truth, and the only way to balance the scales, if you will, is to raise up this false god, this idol called tolerance.

In other words, we cannot call a spade a spade; we cannot call sin what it is – because to do so would be intolerant, and hurting the feelings of another over something like stealing or slandering...

Rather than speak the truth, rather than say "we are wrong", groups and organizations and individuals spend immeasurable effort on trying to make the other group, the other organization look like the villain.

Even in the church repentance has become an unpopular word. You would be surprised to know that there are a LOT of churches in this nation and throughout the world that have concluded that sin is not that big a deal; they have changed their definition of sin, of good and evil, redefining it in a culturally relevant and less offensive way.

Instead of calling people to repentance, to confession, to admitting their sinful state, church leaders will say "eh, it's not that bad; you're not hurting anyone; Jesus loves you and doesn't want to pressure you or cause you any offense or make you uncomfortable."

Thankfully, the NALC is one of the few church bodies left in the world that has not succumb to the <u>pressures of compromise</u> when it comes to sin, to repentance, and to God's Word. However, this also shows in the dwindling membership in churches nationwide; the truth is a hard thing to swallow and people would rather believe a lie than face the truth.


John the Baptist's message to repent was a rejected message during his time – rejected by the proud, the powerful – and it is a message that is rejected today.

But the truth is – the reality is – God's Word does not change. And John the Baptist's cry to repent also doesn't change. Just as the message of repentance called from the wilderness some 2000 years ago, the same message "repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" still cries out to us today.

The world today needs to take this to heart and repent, and turn to God. He is waiting with open arms.

Samaritan's Purse Mission Statement

Three examples of their outreach are:

U.S. Disaster Relief: Since 1998, over 83,000 volunteers have worked with our staff to help more than 28,000 families impacted by U.S. natural disasters—hurricanes, tornadoes, wildfires, floods, and ice storms—by quickly providing emergency supplies, repairing, cleaning and rebuilding homes. Five disaster relief units, tractor-trailers stocked with tools and cleanup supplies, are ready to deploy when disasters strike.

Children's Heart Project: This project brings children to North America to receive life-saving surgery not available in their home countries. To date, Samaritan's Purse has arranged surgery for more than 1,000 children with heart defects.

Operation Heal Our Patriots — This program is designed to strengthen the marriages of wounded and injured members of the U.S. Military. The primary component is Samaritan Lodge Alaska, a wilderness retreat offering outdoor activities and Biblically based marriage enrichment classes. 



Remaining items for the construction progress are to correct construction errors related to landing elevation and drainage, modification of steps to meet original architectural plans, and elimination of flatwork ponding on

approach to elevator, at contractor's cost. After completion, a final walk through will be held to address any items that need to be touched up. The current invoiced total for cost of construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, grass planting, and incidentals is \$600,850.80. *Replacement of parish hall metal entrance doors along with applicable painting

*Replacement of broken and/or cracked asbestos siding shingles on exterior of parish hall along with applicable painting
