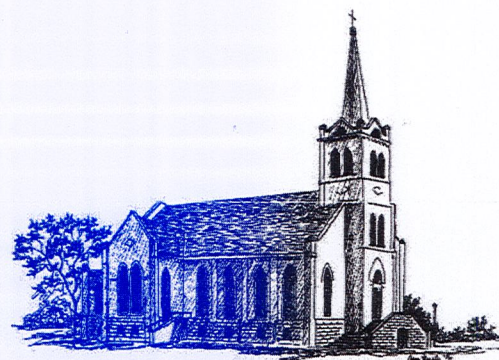

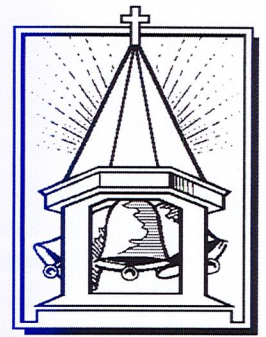

Greetings,

Once again we are starting a New Year. It is the time of year when many make New Year's Resolutions. According to the Chicago Tribune the top three resolutions are, losing weight, quitting some habit, and spending less money. The fourth most popular resolution is to "be a better person."

That is the same message Paul had for the church of Ephesus in the 5th chapter of Ephesians. He said to make the best use of your time, understand the Lord's will, encourage one another, and to thank God for all things. Another way to look at this would be to set your priorities, be positive in your attitude, and work to foster your relationships, all for the glory of God.

Paul spoke of this same theme in his letter to the Philippians and addressed these ideas as (Philippians 3:13 ESV), "*this one thing I do.*" Now he obviously did more than one thing. He made tents. He preached sermons and established churches. He healed the sick. He wrote letters. He did a lot of different things. But he said, "*The top priority in my life is to press on toward the goal for the prize for which God has called me.*" He set this as his number one goal.

It was Jesus who said in Matthew 6:33 (ESV), "*seek first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.*"

Jesus made it clear that the kingdom of God was to be at the top of our priorities. Things such as worship, prayer, reading scripture as well as taking care of our fellow men and women should be right at the beginning of that list. Paul described it this way in his letter to the Philippians. Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." (Philippians 4:8 ESV) This is where our priorities should be set for the upcoming year.

Paul showed that there is more to life than just prioritizing what we do with our time and resources. It's also how we look at things that determines what we will accomplish.

If we focus on events of the past, we may lose sight of the future. Don't focus on what's behind you. You can't change that. Instead, focus on where you want to be, what you want to accomplish and where you want to go. Look to the honorable, pure and commendable things.

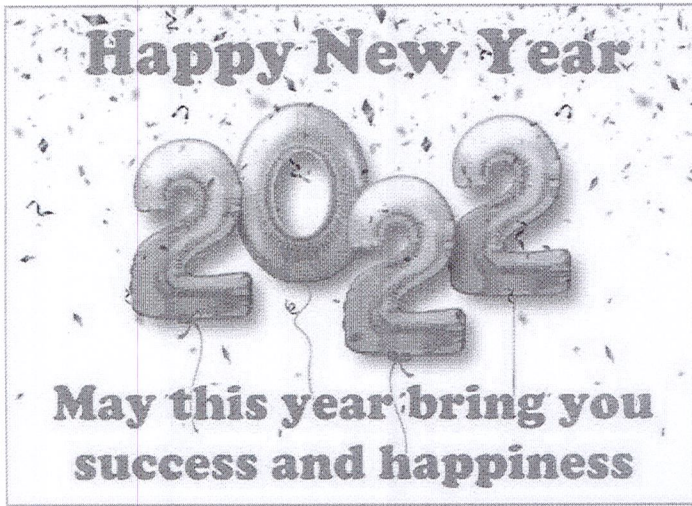
Focusing on the positive aspects of where we can lead our lives, can lead to wonderful things. Without changing the events themselves, a positive attitude can change how you perceive those events. It can also affect those around you. A negative attitude seems to fuel other negative attitudes. But a positive attitude can change the mood of an environment and help build progress towards our goals and priorities as well as encourage those around you.

Set your priorities with God in mind and you will be blessed. Set your attitude on positive things and you will succeed more often than fail. Focus on your relationships and they will flourish in time. These are worthy New Years' resolutions... and one's which we can be proud to strive for.

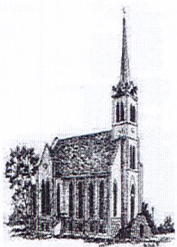
Cole is at home doing well surrounded by the love and support of all his family and friends. He continues to have therapy

NEW Church Renovation Update

Remaining items for the construction progress are to correct construction errors related to landing elevation and drainage, modification of steps to meet original architectural plans, and elimination of flatwork ponding on approach to elevator, at contractor's cost. After completion, a final walk through will be held to address any items that need to be touched up. The current invoiced total for cost of construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, grass planting, and incidentals is \$600,850.80. -Parsonage inspection and related repairs – Pending consultation with basement restoration contractor(s) once selected.

-Security System – Pending additional consultation regarding telemetry option to eliminate routing cables.

-Carpet cleaning – Will be scheduled prior to upcoming Christmas season.

-Bird issue beneath elevator approach awning

-Team consensus for resolution is soffit installation.

Applicable discussion will be ongoing.

-Basement restoration:

Still awaiting additional communications/ approval from engineer regarding plan submitted following initial meeting with prospective contractor.

Tentative meeting with architect planned for early December.

-Currently needed facility repair items including:

- * Replacement of rotted boards along with painting of all wood framing on sanctuary windows and exterior of basement windows

- * Replacement of rotted lumber on sanctuary steeple along with applicable painting

- *Repair of cracks in exterior church walls along with repainting of both these and other areas as applicable

- * Repair of deteriorated flatwork where needed

- *Replacement of rusted metal basement door and repair of rust on sanctuary wing entrance door along with applicable painting

- * Replacement of rotted boards on parish hall exterior, including window framing, along with applicable painting/repainting

- *Replacement of parish hall metal entrance doors along with applicable painting

- *Replacement of broken and/or cracked asbestos siding shingles on exterior of parish hall along with applicable painting

Consensus remains to hold discussions on above needed repairs with potential basement restoration contractors as applicable meetings progress.

Renovation Progress:

Roth Construction did not approve of latest suggested outside mediator. Currently awaiting approval of newly suggested mediator. Dietze and Reese continue to communicate with Roth attorney on matter.

Old Stone Church Committee:

Regularly scheduled meeting in November was rescheduled for Wednesday, December 1, at 9:00 am.

Items For Council Approval: None

Approximate Renovation Fund Donations plus Designated Memorials to date - \$602,383.30

Current Invoiced Renovation Costs to date total \$600,850.80.

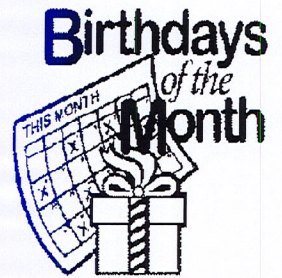

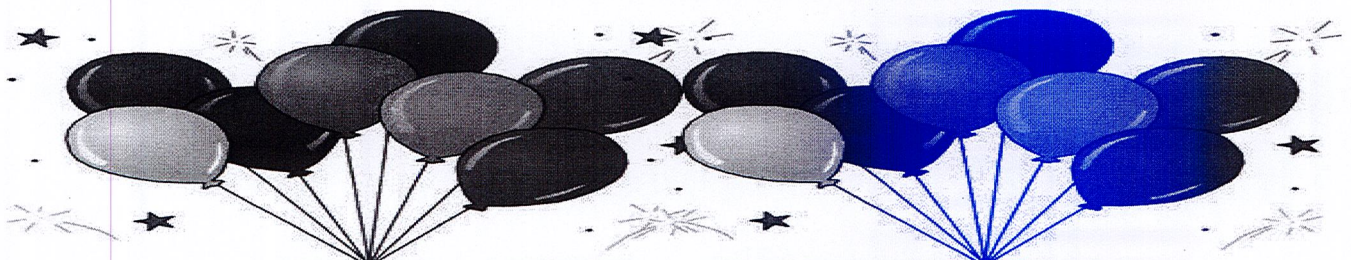

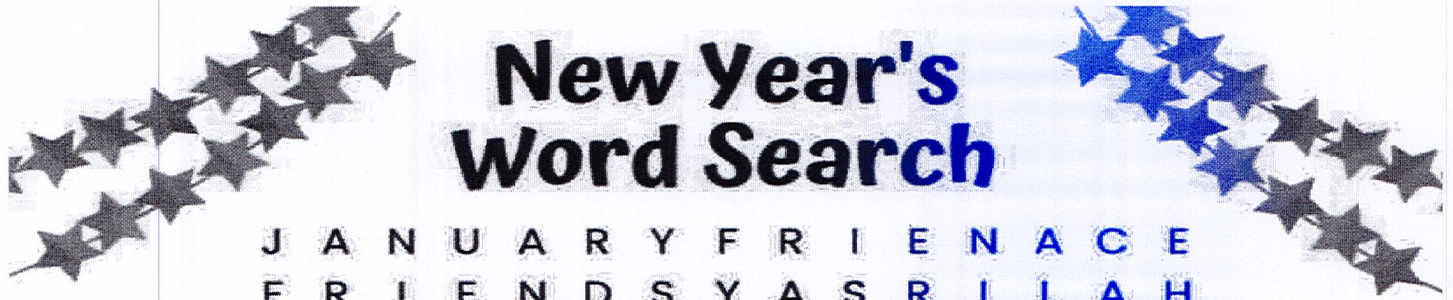
