

Prelude Ringing of the Church Bells Announcements

- L When the days drew near for him to be taken up, Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem to die on the cross for us.
- C So we set our faces to the cross of Christ this Ash Wednesday, and there we face our sins.
- L Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

C The Law makes us face our sins head on, and we come to the cross of Christ confessing.

- L For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.
- C We face our sins this day.
- L But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

C We who have faced our sins and confessed them, are now forgiven.

L We are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

C We thank you, Jesus, for facing the cross and facing our sins for us. Amen.

Are we weak and heavy laden, Cumbered with a load of care? Precious Savior, still our refuge Take it to the Lord in prayer. Do your friends despise, forsake you? Take it to the Lord in prayer. In his arms he'll take and shield you; You will find a solace there.

P Gracious Lord, ashes remind us of our human frailty and mortality. You are eternal, but we are limited in our days. Someday we will return to dust and ashes. You remind us of this in your Word. C Dust we are and to dust we shall return. (Genesis 3:19, Psalm 90:3)

P Ashes speak of condemnation for sin. When Adam fell into sin, judgment and death came to all. Since we all are born into sin we are marked for death and ashes.

C Dust we are and to dust we shall return.

P Ashes speak of our total dependence upon you, O God. We are but frail human beings who must rely upon you, Father. We think we are capable of taking care of ourselves and make our own plans for greatness. However, so often these plans fail and crumble into ashes.

C Dust we are and to dust we shall return.

 \mathbb{P} Ashes speak of our humiliation and repentance. As people in the Bible humbled themselves and expressed their repentance and mourning in the signs of sackcloth and ashes, we also humble ourselves before you, O God, as we ask you to forgive our sins through Jesus Christ, our Lord. As we repent we put on dust and ashes.

C Dust we are and to dust we shall return.

P People of God, as we see the meaning of ashes and dust for us as Christians, we now make our earnest confession unto the Lord.

 \mathbb{C} Almighty God, you have always warned your people against trusting in false gods. We are sinful and this nature has given birth to sinful deeds: things we have done and things we have left undone. We are but dust and ash of the ground and we deserve nothing more than to return to the dust. Though we deserve your stern judgment, but for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, Forgive and renew us. Amen

You have heard the Word of the Lord, "Repent and believe the gospel."

With these words, Jesus began His ministry and now directs us to make repentance and hear his good news. Therefore, as you have made repentance, now hear the gospel. I, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, announce to you the grace of God. Your sins are forgiven, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The imposition of ashes will follow. Those who desire to receive ashes may come forward at the Usher's direction. The minister applies ashes to the forehead of each person with these words: **REMEMBER THAT YOU ARE DUST, AND TO DUST YOU SHALL RETURN.**

First Reading: Exodus 12:1–14

¹² Now the LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² "This month shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the first month of the year for you. ³Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying, 'On the tenth of this month they are, each one, to take a lamb for themselves, according to the fathers' households, a lamb for each household. ⁴Now if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his neighbor nearest to his house are to take one according to the number of persons in them; in proportion to what each one should eat, you are to divide the lamb. ⁵ Your lamb shall be an unblemished male a year old; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. ⁶You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month, then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel is to slaughter it at twilight. ⁷ Moreover, they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. ⁸ They shall eat the flesh that same night, roasted with fire, and they shall eat it with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. ⁹ Do not eat any of it raw or boiled at all with water, but rather roasted with fire, *both* its head and its legs along with its entrails.¹⁰ And you shall not leave any of it over until morning, but whatever is left of it until morning, you shall completely burn with fire. ¹¹Now you shall eat it in this way: with your garment belted around your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it in a hurry—it is the LORD'S Passover. ¹² For I will go through the land of Egypt on that night, and fatally strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the human *firstborn* to animals; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments—I am the LORD. ¹³ The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live; and when I see the blood I will pass over you, and no plague will come upon you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. ¹⁴ 'Now this day shall be a memorial to you, and you shall celebrate it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations you are to celebrate it *as* a permanent ordinance.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:20–6:10

²⁰ Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹ He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin in our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

6 And working together *with Him*, we also urge you not to receive the grace of God in vain— 2 for He says,

"AT A FAVORABLE TIME I LISTENED TO YOU,

AND ON A DAY OF SALVATION I HELPED YOU."

Behold, now is "A FAVORABLE TIME," behold, now is "A DAY OF SALVATION"—³ giving no reason for *taking* offense in anything, so that the ministry will not be discredited, ⁴ but in everything commending ourselves as servants of God, in much endurance, in afflictions, in hardships, in difficulties, ⁵ in beatings, in imprisonments, in mob attacks, in labors, in sleeplessness, in hunger, ⁶ in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, ⁷ in the word of truth, *and* in the power of God; by the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and the left, ⁸ by glory and dishonor, by evil report and good report; *regarded* as deceivers and yet true; ⁹ as unknown and *yet* well known, as dying and *yet* behold, we are alive; as punished and *yet* not put to death, ¹⁰ as sorrowful yet always rejoicing, as poor yet making many rich, as having nothing and *yet* possessing all things.

Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.

Gospel Reading: Luke 22:1-13

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 22nd chapter.

Glory to you O Lord

²² Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread, which is called the Passover, was approaching. ² And the chief priests and the scribes were trying to find a way to put Him to death, since they were afraid of the people.³ And Satan entered Judas, the one called Iscariot, who belonged to the number of the twelve. ⁴ And he left and discussed with the chief priests and officers how he was to betray Him to them. ⁵ And they were delighted, and agreed to give him money. ⁶ And *so* he consented, and *began* looking for a good opportunity to betray Him to them away from the crowd.⁷ Now the *first* day of Unleavened Bread came, on which the Passover *lamb* had to be sacrificed. ⁸ And *so Jesus* sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, so that we may eat *it*." ⁹ They said to Him, "Where do You want us to prepare *it*?" ¹⁰ And He said to them, "When you have entered the city, a man carrying a pitcher of water will meet you; follow him into the house that he enters. ¹¹ And you shall say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room in which I may eat the Passover with My disciples?" ¹² And he will show you a large, furnished upstairs room; prepare *it* there." ¹³ And they left and found *everything* just as He had told them; and they prepared the Passover
