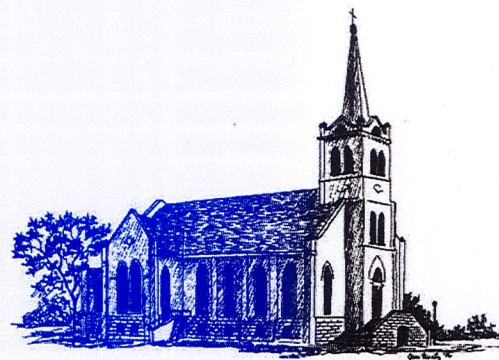

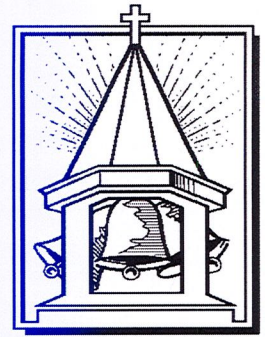

Greetings,

Someone recently asked where the term “Ash Wednesday” came from I have to admit I had to do some research. In the days when fire was vital for cooking and heat, a major part of keeping house was keeping ashes under control. During times when serious problems arose that housekeeping chore would often be left undone and so a person who was in mourning – suffering distress - would often have ashes on their face. Eventually putting on ashes became part of the mourning process. Ash Wednesday is about mourning for the sin which makes the sacrifice necessary.

Lent is a season of soul-searching, a time for reflection and taking stock. In the earliest days of the Church lent began as a time of preparation for Easter, and by observing lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus’ withdrawal into the wilderness. How can we use the 40 days of Lent to prepare our hearts for Christendom’s most sacred Holy-Day? What do we do during the 40 days to shake ourselves from business as usual to a more spiritually attuned life?

Some think social issues are important so they focus on soup kitchens, and addiction foundations, and AIDS and homeless shelters and battered women all the while pointing out how Jesus fed the hungry. Some are more drawn to moral issues, so they picket abortion clinics, send e-mails about same sex marriage, campaign against all kind of moral issues and point to how Jesus dealt with the money changers and the Pharisees. Still others are more excited by doctrinal issues, they seek to imitate Jesus’ teaching and scripture use.

But what does God want us to do? What does God want us to give up? The true purpose of a Lenten sacrifice is to sacrifice those things in our lives that clutter our life and/or impede our relationship with God. Lent then is also a time for people to experience and reflect on the sufferings of Jesus, in light of personal sin and unrighteousness.

So often what we give up during Lent is totally insignificant. It’s insignificant because once Lent is over we go back to doing what we did before. God wants us to live a life in service to Him. God wants to have a relationship with Him and to put Him first in our life.

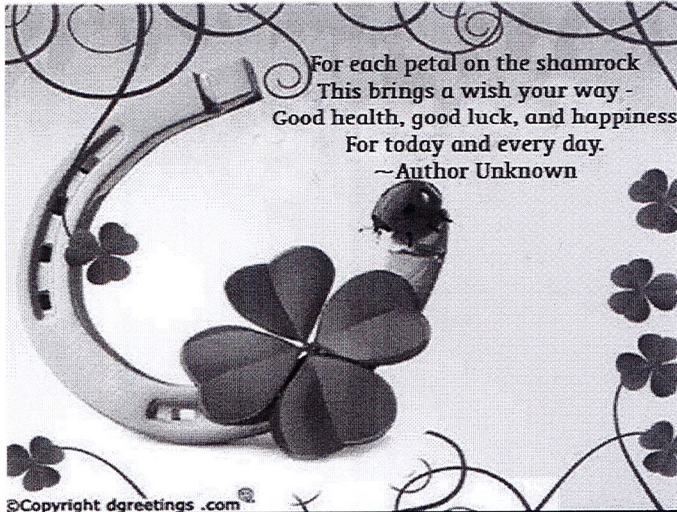
Lent should not be viewed as a Legalistic or Compulsory Act - rather as a fantastic opportunity to set time apart for spiritual cleansing – renewal - preparation. Although there is no specific mention of Lent in the Bible, time set apart for repentance and mourning in ashes is referenced several times.

God is calling us to a Lent where relearn what it means to be loved, redeemed, sanctified, empowered, strengthened, and cherished by a loving God.

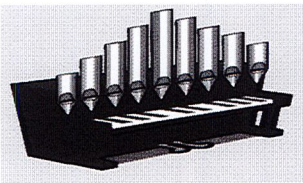
### NALC Warehouse

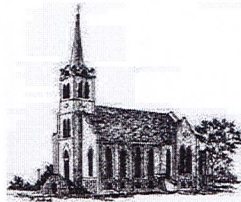

## NEW Church Renovation Update

Remaining items for the construction progress are to correct construction errors related to landing elevation and drainage, modification of steps to meet original architectural plans, and elimination of flatwork ponding on approach to elevator, at contractor's cost. After completion, a final walk through will be held to address any items that need to be touched up. The current invoiced total for cost of construction, change orders, materials testing, architect, grass planting, and incidentals is \$600,850.80. Designated giving and memorials received to date total \$603,183.30.

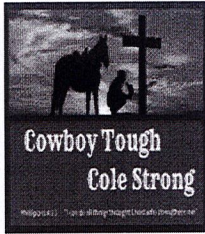

- 2022 budgeted extent of and bids for currently needed facility repair items including:

\* Replacement of rotted boards along with painting of all wood framing on sanctuary windows and exterior of basement windows

\* Replacement of rotted lumber on sanctuary steeple along with applicable painting

\*Repair of cracks in exterior church walls along with repainting of both these and other areas as applicable

\* Repair of deteriorated flatwork where needed

\*Replacement of rusted metal basement door and repair of rust on sanctuary wing entrance door along with applicable painting

\* Replacement of rotted boards on parish hall exterior, including window framing, along with applicable painting/repainting

\*Replacement of parish hall metal entrance doors along with applicable painting



\*Replacement of broken and/or cracked asbestos siding shingles on exterior of parish hall along with applicable painting

Consensus remains to hold discussions on above needed repairs with potential basement restoration contractors as applicable meetings progress.

- Outside mediator has been agreed upon by involved parties. Tentative mediation meeting date is February 7<sup>th</sup>.
