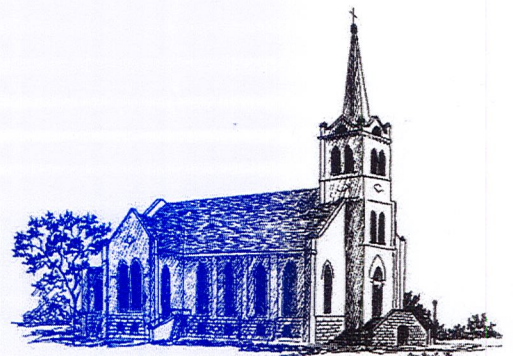

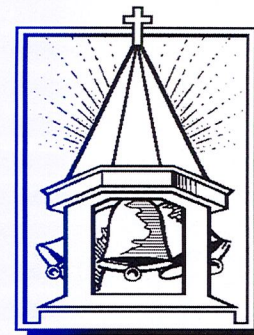

Greetings,

We are rapidly approaching Easter. On Easter we will celebrate what God has done for us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

I have been doing a series entitled Return to God which is based on the book of Joel. The prophet paints a vivid picture of the coming judgment of God, the Day of the Lord.

Joel's prophecy has teeth even today as wars rage, natural disasters threaten and destroy, and our culture seems to be unraveling. But right in the middle of this frightening portent, we find a tender invitation from the Lord: *"Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster"* (Joel 2:13). God's invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares.

During this Lenten Season we have explored Joel's plea to "Return to God." I have tried to show how the call to return played out in partial ways for the people who walked alongside Christ as He demonstrated and carried out God's grace and mercy on our behalf by taking God's wrath upon Himself, setting the stage for God to *"turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him"* (Joel 2:14).

It is my hope that this series, which focused on particular events in the Passion, with a special focus on the people involved in the event. It is my hope that by studying the events and people will help us to connect the hearers with their own sinful nature, to emphasize how we have turned away from the Lord, and to reinforce and rejoice in God's call for us to return to Him with all our heart,

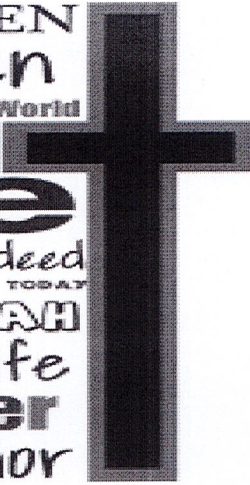
I sincerely hope that this series has blessed you and that we all Return to God.

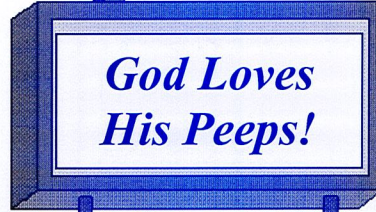

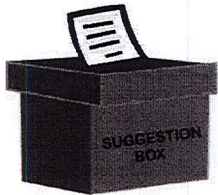

Samaritan's Purse Ukraine Emergency Alert Mission Statement

This organization has provided teams on the ground in Poland, Moldova, and Romania to care for and help the refugees. They have also been asked to set up a hospital inside the Ukraine border to care for those who have been unable to leave. SP operates a 24 hr Medical Clinic in LVIV and an Emergency Outpatient Clinic in southern Ukraine. They are providing hygiene kits, blankets, and delivering food to local churches to distribute to those in need.

Our gift will enable Samaritan's Purse to offer life-saving medical care and other emergency assistance to those who fled the fighting in Ukraine.

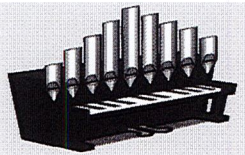
NALC Warehouse

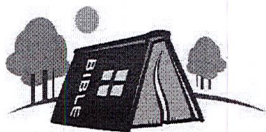

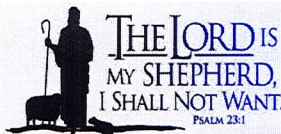

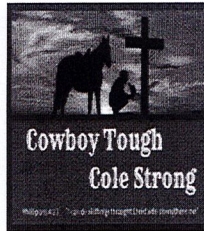

PROPERTY TEAM REPORT FEBRUARY 2022

Maintenance Schedule Discussion

- Annual AC Inspection – Marv will discuss with Gohmert AC Service
- Cemetery preparation for Easter and Grave Decoration – Will check with Cemetery Committee to tentatively schedule workday for various items including raising cemetery row markers as needed.

Items Complete:

- Restroom and kitchen supplies replenished
- AC filters checked/ changed
- Meeting with engineer regarding basement restoration

- Long awaited formal renovation issue mediation meeting held on February 7th

Renovation Progress:

- Discussed brief general update regarding February 7th mediation meeting and pending agreement finalization. Also discussed prioritization of repair issues subject to execution of final agreement. Team consensus was to consider flatwork ponding along with elevator landing drainage, issues of highest priority. Mats will be purchased for the landing area to lessen effects of the current slick surface during wet conditions, pending installation of a permanent solution.

Other Discussion Items:

- Cemetery workday – See above.
- Parsonage inspection and plan for necessary repairs- Still pending consultation with basement restoration contractor(s) once selected

- Basement Restoration - Details of meeting with Keith Sanders, structural engineer, along with his resulting recommendations, were briefly discussed.
- Organ Upgrade – Marv reported that Visser Pipe Organ removed the organ console on Wednesday, February 16th, and that all went smoothly. Mr. Visser signed a workman's comp waiver form. He stated that he had received all of the parts necessary for the upgrade.
- Parish Hall painting – Pending consultation with basement restoration contractor(s) once selected.
- Church window frame painting - (Note "Parish Hall painting" above)
- Sanctuary steeple repair – Awaiting proposal from Jacob Abshur/Abshur Construction who contracted for repairs done on the Old Stone Church steeple.
- Awning bird issue resolution – Consensus remains that some form of soffit installation will ultimately be required.


