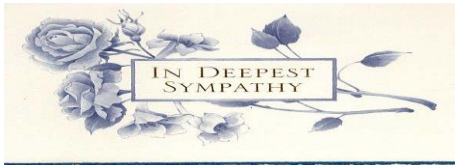


Samaritan's Purse Ukraine Emergency Alert Mission Statement

This organization has provided teams on the ground in Poland, Moldova, and Romania to care for and help the refugees. They have also been asked to set up a hospital inside the Ukraine border to care for those who have been unable to leave. SP operates a 24 hr Medical Clinic in LVIV and an Emergency Outpatient Clinic in southern Ukraine. 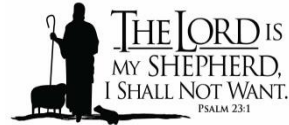
Church Camp

All fundraiser money will go toward camp expenses. Thank you & God bless!

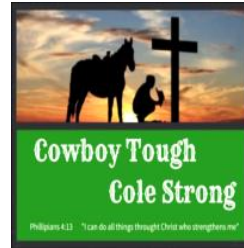

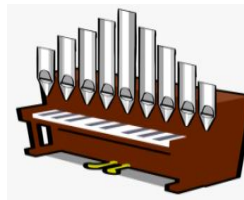
