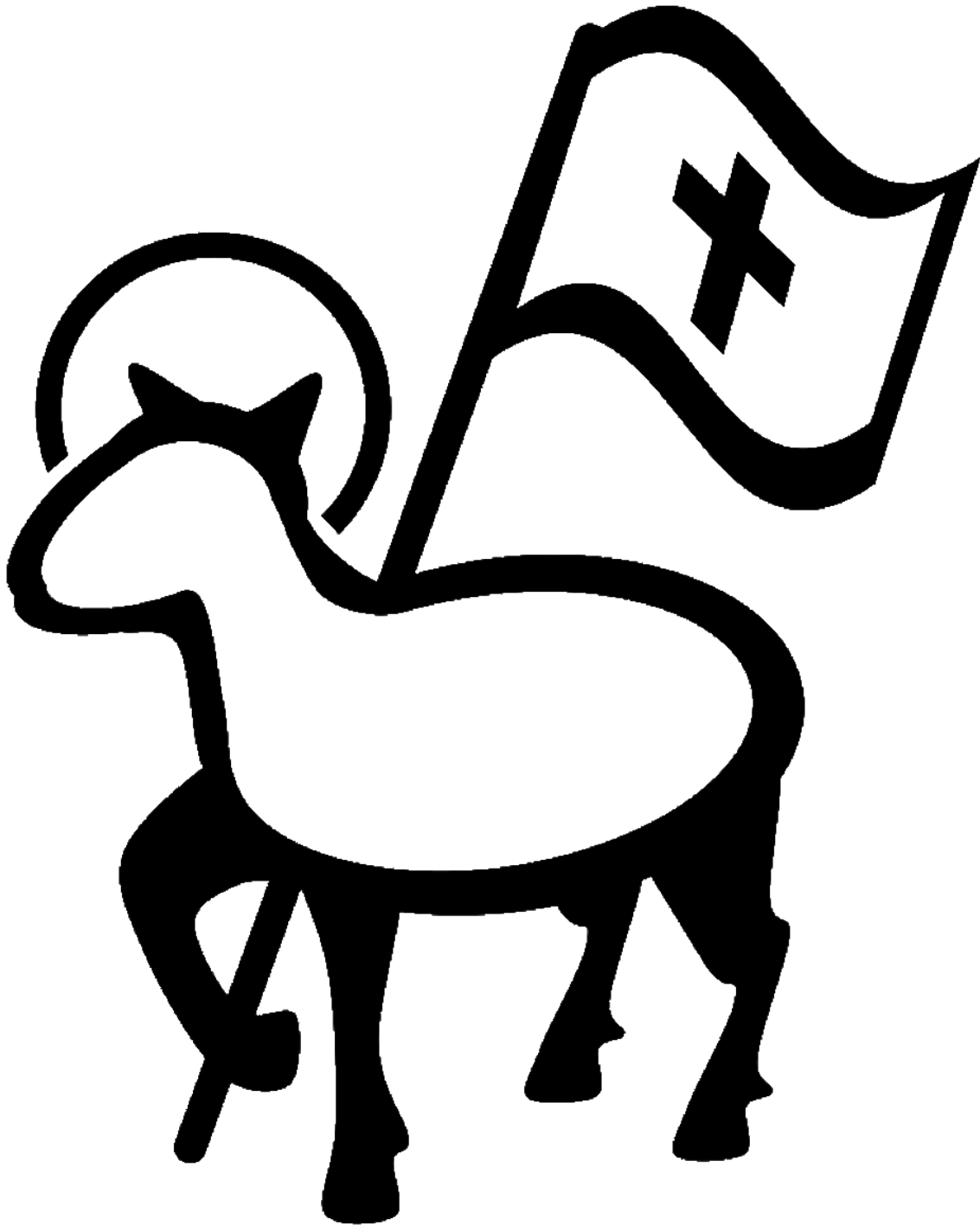

First Reading: Revelations 7:[2-8] 9-17

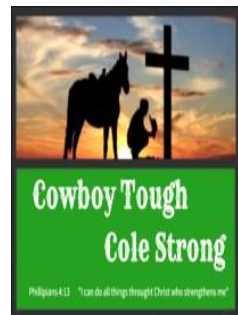
