Faithfulness to the message of the Lord is lived out in human life first by listening and then by being obedient. 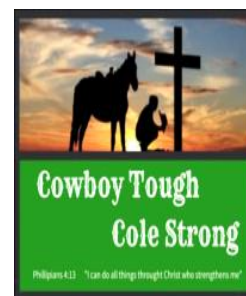

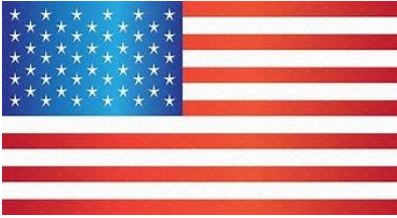
