¹²“Yet even now,” declares the LORD, “Return to Me with all your heart, And with fasting, weeping, and mourning; ¹³ And tear your heart and not *merely* your garments.” Now return to the LORD your God, For He is gracious and compassionate, Slow to anger, abounding in mercy And relenting of catastrophe. ¹⁴ Who knows, He might turn and relent, And leave a blessing behind Him, *Resulting in* a grain offering and a drink offering For the LORD your God. ¹⁵ Blow a trumpet in Zion, Consecrate a fast, proclaim a solemn assembly, ¹⁶ Gather the people, sanctify the congregation, Assemble the elders, Gather the children and the nursing infants. Behold, now is “A FAVORABLE TIME,” behold, now is “A DAY OF SALVATION”—³ giving no reason for *taking* offense in anything, so that the ministry will not be discredited,⁴ but in everything commending ourselves as servants of God, in much endurance, in afflictions, in hardships, in difficulties,⁵ in beatings, in imprisonments, in mob attacks, in labors, in sleeplessness, in hunger,⁶ in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love,⁷ in the word of truth, *and* in the power of God; by the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and the left,⁸ by glory and dishonor, by evil report and good report; *regarded* as deceivers and yet true;⁹ as unknown and *yet* well known, as dying and *yet* behold, we are alive; as punished and *yet* not put to death,¹⁰ as sorrowful yet always rejoicing, as poor yet making many rich, as having nothing and *yet* possessing all things.

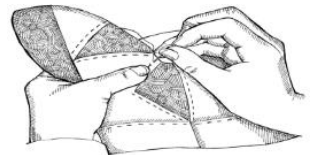

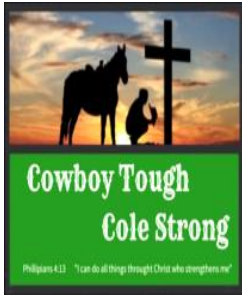
CAMAL House Dish Soap
