First Reading: Genesis 32:22-30

²² Now he got up that same night and took his two wives, his two female slaves, and his eleven children, and crossed the shallow place of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream. And he sent across whatever he had.

Then Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵ When *the man* saw that he had not prevailed against him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip; and the socket of Jacob's hip was dislocated while he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the dawn is breaking." But he said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." ²⁷ So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." ²⁸ Then he said, "Your name shall no longer be Jacob, but Israel; for you have contended with God and with men, and have prevailed." ²⁹ And Jacob asked him and said, "Please tell me your name." Second Reading: Romans 8:22-28

For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. ²³ And not only *that*, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for *our* adoption as sons *and daughters*, the redemption of our body. ²⁴ For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he *already* sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, through perseverance we wait eagerly *for it*. ²⁶ Now in the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know what to pray for as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for *us* with groanings too deep for words; ²⁷ and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to *the will of* God. ²⁸ And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to *His* purpose.

We are collecting again for the warehouse. We will be collecting 3 mL contractor bags and cleaning rags for the month of February.




