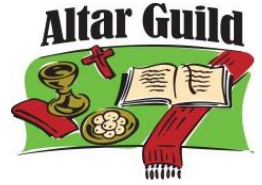

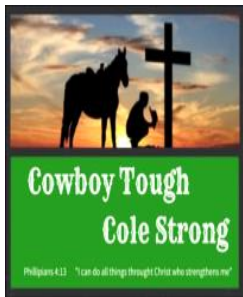

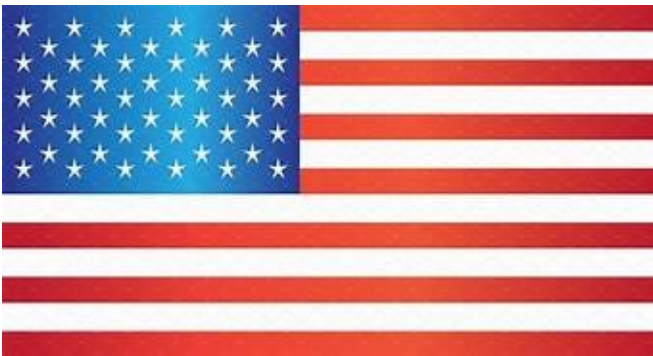

Reformation 500

Moments with Martin Luther

As a monk of the Augustinian Order of Hermits, Martin Luther lived an ordered life, worshiping according to the canonical hours, memorizing the psalms, singing hymns, and praying without ceasing. Throughout this time, Luther was plagued with what he called *anfechtung* — the struggle with sin upon serious self examination, and continued his search for a way to appease an angry God. On **April 2, 1507**, Martin Luther was ordained into the priesthood of the Roman Catholic Church. The ceremony took place at St. Mary Church in Erfurt, Germany, with his father and some other family friends in attendance. Luther later recalled how he trembled when he first held the cup of Holy Communion at the altar, so terrified was he of the privilege and responsibility of the office. The more he “progressed” in the status of his vocation, the more he struggled with feelings of unworthiness and his worries about getting things wrong. Luther had yet to discover that the Sacrament was not based on his own goodness and holiness, but on the sure and certain Word of Christ. That would take a few more years. His fear of God was not the only barrier Luther had to overcome. He still wanted to be reconciled to his father, Hans, who accused him of being a disobedient son for entering the monastery in the first place. Luther argued that his experience in the storm and the vow he had made had confirmed his call from God. His father, however, questioned whether it might not have been God but the devil who had led Martin astray. Luther’s earthly father may never have been quite sure, but his Heavenly Father had much work for Luther to accomplish!

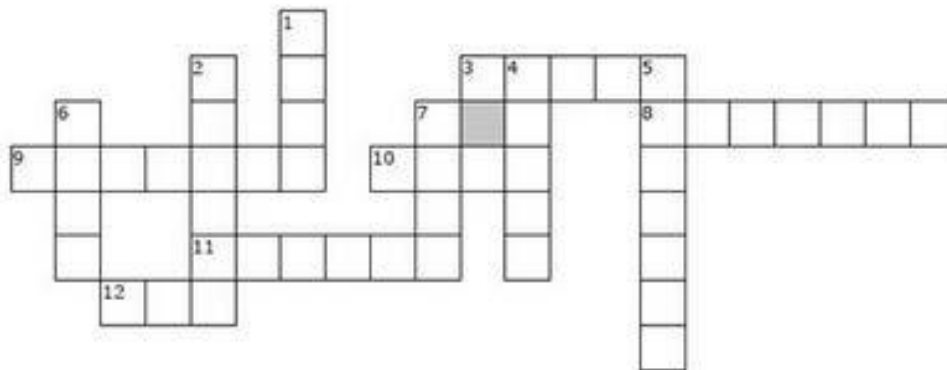
