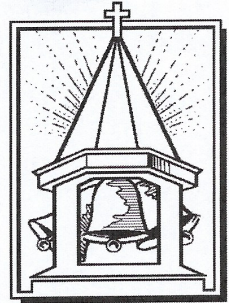

Greetings,

During the Season of Lent, I am doing two series. On Sundays I am doing a sermon on Return to The Lord. Throughout the Old Testament we see time and again where the Israelites stray from God, are defeated in battle, and are exiled to the conquering country. Each time God leaves a remnant to lead the Israelites to return to God.

Lent is a time of renewal of faith and life in Christ. It is a time for us to reflect on our lives and repent, and renew our faith. Repentance is always the divine work of the Holy Spirit through the Law and the Gospel. A Lenten focus on the cross and Passion of the Lord Jesus Christ is a proclamation and confession of the Law and the Gospel, a preaching of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Lent should bring the cross to sinners and sinners to the cross of Christ as the fountain and source of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

This is the basis for the series, Return to the Lord.

On Wednesdays, I will be using the theme of Promised Treasures. The Lenten season also provides us a fresh opportunity to embrace God's amazing love for us, His baptized children, in new ways. Paul clearly says that "faith comes from hearing" (Romans 10:17). But the Gospel is also communicated through the physical senses of sight, smell, touch, and taste. Jesus mentions that a good teacher not only brings out new treasures but reminds people of old and rich treasures as well. So, each Wednesday in Lent, we will take a weekly journey to concretely see, smell, touch, and taste a number of biblical elements. Our Lenten series is called *Promised Treasures*. Just as Israel wandered through the wilderness under Moses for forty years, awaiting the Promised Land, we await heaven in the wilderness of this life.

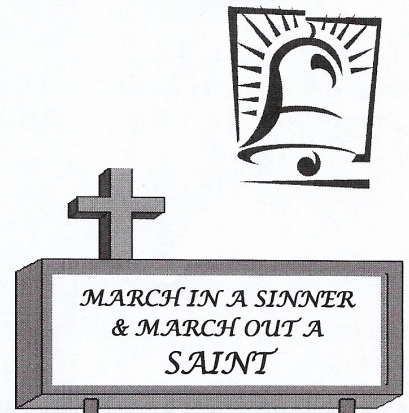
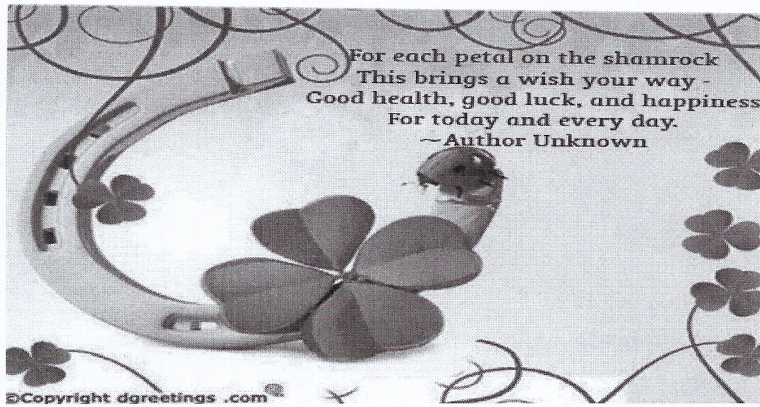
Until we enter our eternal promised land, however, the Lord calls us to be His light in this dark world (see Colossians 3; Ephesians 4). This series will begin with ashes, then proceed to salt, water, light, bread, and finally, palms. All these beautiful Old and New Testament elements will remind you of God's eternal love in Christ, fill you with renewed hope, and increase your joy, knowing that because we are His baptized children, God is near to us now more than ever.

These series are provided by Concordia Publishing and I feel they are messages we all should hear in this Lenten season.

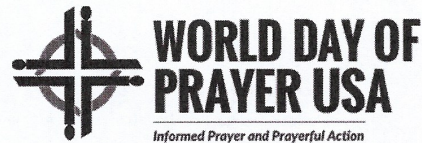
Tax Tips for Traditional IRA Owners



If you have a traditional IRA and you are 70 ½ years old and older, you are required to take a RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) annually.

There is a provision in the regulations that allow you to have this distribution made directly to a qualifying non-profit (church, etc.) and not be liable for income taxes on that amount.

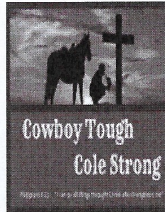

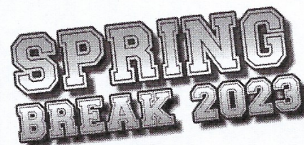
Good News and Great Joy From 2022!

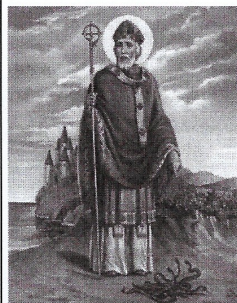

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people.

In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on

March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well-known legend of St. Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.

Cemetery Regulations - Adopted 04/23/2019

FRIENDLY REMINDER:

**PLEASE HELP TO KEEP OUR CEMETERY AND
ADJACENT GROUNDS LOOKING THEIR BEST....**

CEMETERY DECORATIONS

In respect of those buried in this cemetery, St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church feels responsible for keeping our cemetery presentable and well maintained into perpetuity. In order to accomplish this at a sustainable cost, all users must abide by the following rules concerning decorations:

- A. In-ground vases, ornaments, figurines, statues, pictures, glass or other breakable containers, trellises, shepherd hooks, loose flowers, solar lights, or any commemorative articles of non-degradable materials are not permitted and will be removed and discarded without notice.
- B. All vases shall be attached permanently to the headstone or slab or be of sufficient weight to resist windy conditions. All flowers shall be adequately secured in the previously described vases to keep them from blowing out. Loose flowers on graves will not be permitted.
- C. White solar powered decorations are allowed (one per grave) if they are attached to the headstone or base and not placed in the grass.
- D. Funeral flowers and wreaths placed on fresh graves shall be removed within two weeks of the funeral.
- E. Flags look impressive on a cemetery, but they fade quickly and usually do not stay upright long if placed directly into the ground. If flags are used, they shall be placed in a small diameter pvc plastic pipe driven into the ground next to the headstone as to not impede mowing. Only one flag per grave is permitted.

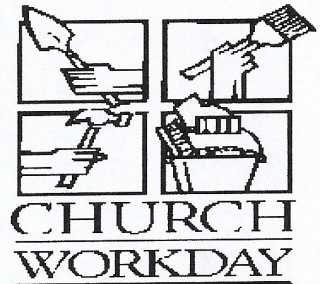
The cemetery committee at their discretion shall remove and discard any decorations that they deem inappropriate.
