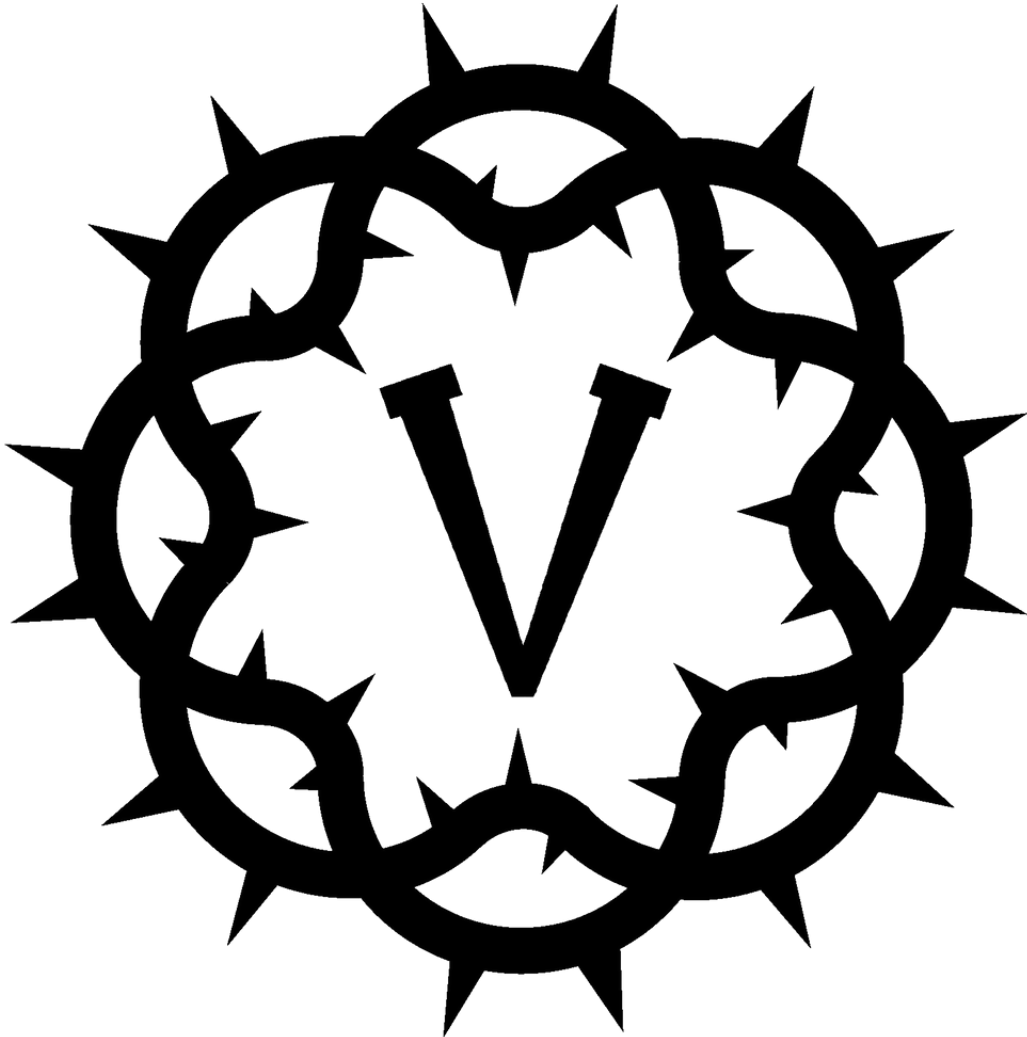

Do not destroy with your choice of food that person for whom Christ died. 16 Therefore do not let what is for you a good thing be spoken of as evil; 17 for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

²⁸ Then they brought Jesus from Caiaphas into the Praetorium, and it was early; and they themselves did not enter the Praetorium, so that they would not be defiled, but might eat the Passover. ²⁹ Therefore Pilate came out to them and said, "What accusation are you bringing against this Man?" ³⁰ They answered and said to him, "If this Man were not a criminal, we would not have handed Him over to you." ³¹ So Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves, and judge Him according to your law." The Jews said to him, "We are not permitted to put anyone to death." ³² This happened so that the word of Jesus which He said, indicating what kind of death He was going to die, would be fulfilled.

³³ Therefore Pilate entered the Praetorium again, and summoned Jesus and said to Him, "You are the King of the Jews?" ³⁴ Jesus answered, "Are you saying this on your own, or did others

tell you about Me?”³⁵ Pilate answered, “I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests handed You over to me; what have You done?”³⁶ Jesus answered, “My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm.”³⁷ Therefore Pilate said to Him, “So You are a king?” Jesus answered, “You say correctly that I am a king. For this purpose I have been born, and for this I have come into the world: to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to My voice.”³⁸ Pilate said to Him, “What is truth?” And after saying this, he came out again to the Jews and said to them, “I find no grounds at all for charges in His case.

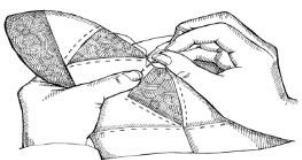
Welcome Visitors! We would like to extend a special welcome to all visitors. If you are looking for a church home, we pray you would consider St. John's.

“The Sign of the Cross”

The “sign of the cross” is a physical movement of the hands made when speaking the name of the Trinity - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This historical tradition is used in many churches as a reminder that God has laid claim to our lives through our Baptism into his name. In worship, the sign of the cross is often placed upon the people by the pastor; at the same time, individuals may also trace the sign of the cross over their own heart. Using the right hand, the first movement is down, from head to stomach (God to us). The second movement traces a “J” down and up to the heart (death to life). The third movement goes across from left to right (me to you).

TURKEY EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE by SAMARITAN'S PURSE



Teams have been working on the ground to assess needs in southern Turkey near the border with Syria. Samaritan's Purse set up an Emergency Field Hospital and the critically needed items are airlifted in Turkey to help people as they recover. More supplies will be provided. Many 10's of 1000's are injured and the death toll exceeds 35,000.

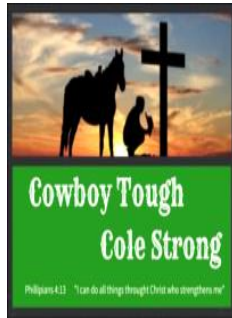
