

Greetings,

If we watch the news, it is evident that we are living in a world that is in turmoil. Everyone has a different view and if your view is different than theirs you are a, insert the term of your choice. It has become an us vs. them situation on nearly every topic.

A recent poll by the Wall Street Journal-NORC, showed that in 1998 62% of Americans said that religion was very important to them. In 2019 the same poll showed this had declined to 48% and this year the poll showed that had declined to 39%.

When asked how often they attend religious services 32% say never and only 18% say every week or nearly every week. The poll also states that people place less value on sharing their religious views with their children.

Community is also an extremely important part of Christianity. The poll showed that the value of community had decreased from 62% in 2019 to 27% this year. Additionally, it showed that patriotism was 70% in 1998 and that this year 35% said it was somewhat important and 27% said it was not at all important or not that important.

These figures are from the population in general and I wondered about our priorities. How much of a priority is the church in our lives? How often do we attend church? How involved are we in church activities? Are we giving back to God as much as He gives to us.


How much of a priority is community? Are we as involved in community activities as we should be. Are we teaching our children to be involved in the community?



If you have a traditional IRA and you are 70 ½ years old and older, you are required to RMD (Required Minimum take Distribution) annually.


There is a provision in the regulations that allow you to have this distribution made directly to a qualifying non-profit (church, etc.) and not be liable for income taxes on that amount.

CALL TO ORDER: Glenn called the meeting to order.

OPENING DEVOTION: Charles led us in a devotion based on John 3:18. "Whoever believes in God is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son." Pastor led us in opening prayer.

Rachel requested a meeting with Pastor Boor to discuss Parish Ed responsibilities and expectations. This meeting was held **February 15, 2023** at 7 pm.

Regarding a digital *contact list* of adult volunteers and children, Pastor mentioned that Kathy has a contact list for the children. There is not currently adult volunteer contact list, but one can be created.

Regarding *budget*, classroom supplies do not need preapproval, but all other requests need to be discussed and approved in advance. M'Liss can order classroom supplies.

Regarding *Facebook* guidelines, Pastor advised Rachel to reach out to M'Liss for details about posting guidelines and/or to be added to the parish Facebook page.

Regarding parish *calendar of events*, Pastor mentioned that Johnny had a similar list and recommended reaching out to him.

Regarding *curriculum*, it was stated that Parish Ed gets to set the curriculum, as long as it adheres to the parish constitution and by-laws.

Regarding *summer camp*, it was suggested that we contact Camp Lone Start as soon as possible to get a list of available dates. We will need to discuss who is eligible to attend, the number of spots to reserve, and whether/what types of fundraisers may be conducted before camp.

Regarding *Easter sunrise service*, Johnna has agreed to organize the youth service. Johnna mentioned that she'd prefer the service not to be held in the Old Stone

Church, as is tradition. We will need council feedback on this suggestion.

Regarding *youth group*, it was confirmed that there is not currently a leader. However, we should try to actively recruit. Dawn & Darren Otto are previous youth group leaders and would be a good source of information. Youth group typically includes students who are confirmation age (5th grade) and older. The 5th Sundays in 2023 are currently earmarked for youth group services and/or activities.

Regarding *Sunday School* in the summer, Trish stated that this was added to ensure consistency for kids and parents.

Regarding *Parish Ed committee meetings*, Rachel will try to get these scheduled on a regular basis. At the first meeting, the committee will discuss VBS, teacher recommendations for Pre-K/Kinder, annual goals for Sunday School attendance, and engagement activities for youth.

FRIENDLY REMINDER:

PLEASE HELP TO KEEP OUR CEMETERY AND ADJACENT GROUNDS LOOKING THEIR BEST....

CEMETERY DECORATIONS

In respect of those buried in this cemetery, St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church feels responsible for keeping our cemetery presentable and well maintained into perpetuity. In order to accomplish this at a sustainable cost, all users must abide by the following rules concerning decorations:

- A. In-ground vases, ornaments, figurines, statues, pictures, glass or other breakable containers, trellises, shepherd hooks, loose flowers, solar lights, or any commemorative articles of non-degradable materials are not permitted and will be removed and discarded without notice.
- B. All vases shall be attached permanently to the headstone or slab or be of sufficient weight to resist windy conditions. All flowers shall be adequately secured in the previously described vases to keep them from blowing out. Loose flowers on graves will not be permitted.
- C. White solar powered decorations are allowed (one per grave) if they are attached to the headstone or base and not placed in the grass.
- D. Funeral flowers and wreaths placed on fresh graves shall be removed within two weeks of the funeral.
- E. Flags look impressive on a cemetery, but they fade quickly and usually do not stay upright long if placed directly into the ground. If flags are used, they shall be placed in a small diameter pvc plastic pipe driven into the ground next to the headstone as to not impede mowing. Only one flag per grave is permitted.

The cemetery committee at their discretion shall remove and discard any decorations that they deem inappropriate.
