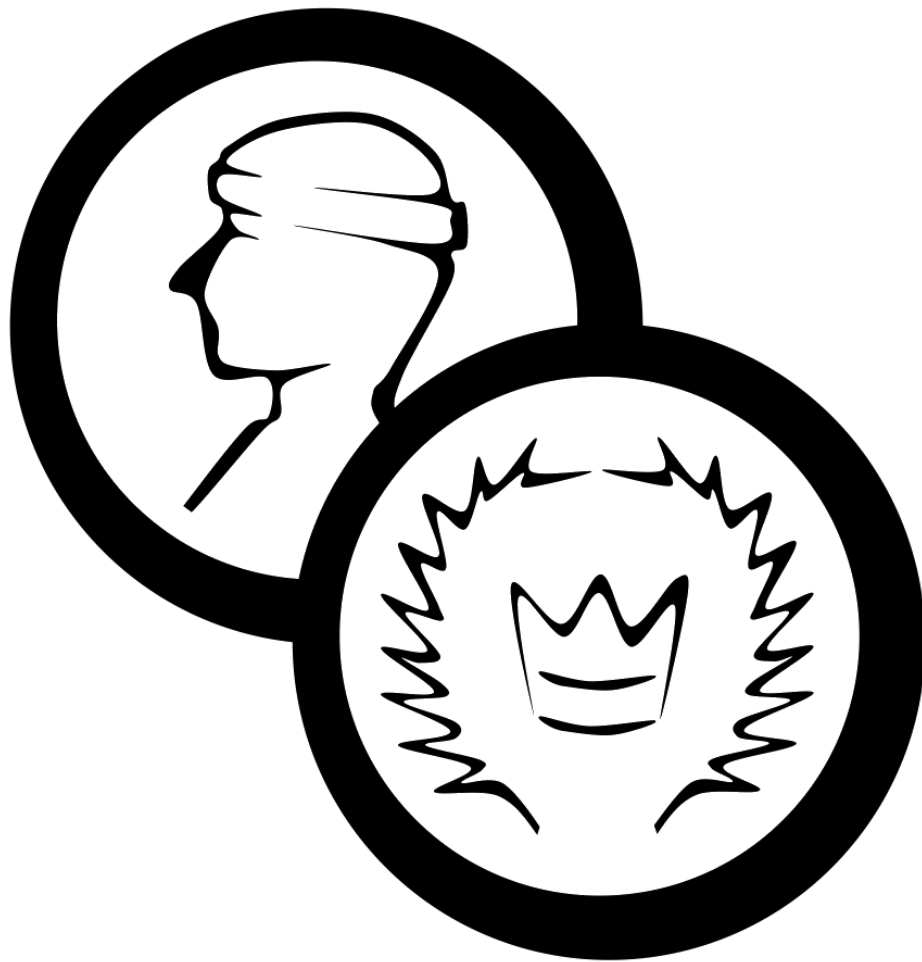

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

Though King Cyrus of Persia did not know the God of Israel, God still used him to bring His people back into a covenant relationship. 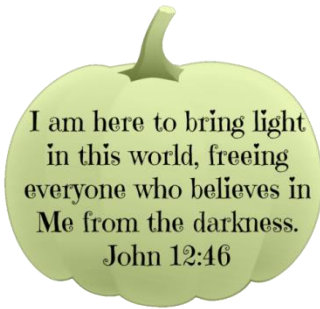

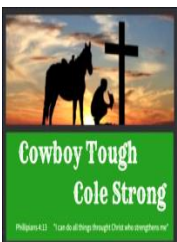
