AS WE GATHER Gracie Diebel

The psalmist sang praises magnifying the Lord, while in the Old Testament scripture for today, Elijah fled the wrath of his enemy, Queen Jezebel. There will always be those who are hard hearted and will not believe in God. They may want to hurt us, but God is always with us.
