Greetings,

Philippians 4:6-7 reads, "⁶ Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supplication is defined as a form of prayer, a call for help from God. It is a prayer that has a spirit of reverence and devotion, a solemn prayer, to plead humbly to a higher power.

What Paul is saying is that we can take everything to God in prayer. It has been said, "There is nothing too great for God's power; and nothing too small for his fatherly care." Just as our children may take anything, large or small, to a parent, and whatever happens is of interest to the parent, we may take to God and like a loving parent, it is of interest and concern to God.

We can pray for ourselves or others. We can pray for forgiveness for the past, for the things we need in the present, and for help and guidance for the future. We can take it all into the presence of God. We can comment to God's care those near and far who are within our memories and our hearts.

Paul is also plain that, "thanksgiving must be the universal accompaniment of prayer." Every prayer must include thanks for the great privilege of prayer itself. Paul further insists that we must give thanks in everything, in sorrows and joys alike. This implies two things, gratitude and perfect submission to the will of God. We must truly believe that God is working all things together for good in order to feel the perfect gratitude which believing prayer demands.

When we pray, we must remember three things. We must remember the love of God, which desires only what is best for us. And the wisdom of God, and trust that He knows what is best for us. And finally, the power of God, which can bring to us that which is best for us.

If we pray a believing prayer we will receive the true peace of God. God's peace will watch over our hearts. And that peace is as Paul says, a peace, "which surpasses all comprehension."



Church Council Minutes ~ September 24, 2024 Trish Hood

Members Present: Pastor Boor, Glenn Ruschhaupt (President), Kyle Newman (Vice President), Trish Hood (Secretary), Archie Abrameit (Treasurer), M'Liss Moore (Financial Secretary), Kathy Dunn (Finance), Cathie Bettge (Mission/Evangelism), Beverly Bodden (Parish Life), Marv Sager (Property) Brenda Gohmert (Worship).

Call to Order: Glenn called the meeting to order.

Opening Devotion: Cathie led us in devotion based on Luke 5, the story of Jesus telling the fishermen to throw their

nets to the other side, and they got so many fish that they had to get another boat to hold them all. Jesus told them they were now fishers of men. The leadership of churches today is a lot like fishermen. Even Jesus understands the mundane jobs that fishermen and Christians must do.

Minutes of Previous Regular Meeting: Kathy made a motion, and Brenda seconded to approve the minutes with correction of date as presented. Motion passed.

<u>Financial Report</u>: M'Liss made the motion to accept the financial report, and Cathie seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Pastor Report</u>: The Camal Board met this week and we reviewed the increase in families served, the impact this has on our current location, and how to meet the needs in the future. The number of families served is on a continual rise. We reviewed the average number of families served during the first 8 months of 2004 (241), 2014 (374), and 2024 (400). The current location is overwhelmed and we were gifted land on the corner of Main and Indianola and we voted to enter into a contract with RMA to design a building for it and discussed companies to organize a fundraising campaign. As a reminder I will be on vacation 9/30 - 10/5, at a Pastor's Retreat 10/15-10/17, and in New Ulm for the Ficklen wedding on 10/18 - 10/19.

Finance Team: Finance committee met on September 16 with Pastor John Boor, Glenn Ruschhaupt, Archie Abrameit, Laurie Wendel, Kathy Dunn and M'Liss Moore present. Pastor opened with prayer. We reviewed all the budget reports in detail.

It was suggested that we start planning for our new budget year. We will ask Meliss Eckhardt to prepare reports for each committee with what they have spent so far in 2024. Each committee should submit their budget request by November 1. We closed with the Lord prayer. ~Kathy Dunn

The following explains how to become a member of St. John and retain that membership throughout the years.

BYLAWS of ST. JOHN EV. LUTHERAN CHURCH PART III – MEMBERSHIP

A. Baptized Members 1. A child, one or both of whose parents or guardians are members of the congregation, shall, upon receiving Baptism, become a baptized member. 2. A child, neither of whose parents or guardians is a member of the congregation, shall upon receiving Baptism, become a baptized member of the congregation; unless for good reason

he is to be a baptized member of another congregation, in which case his membership shall be transferred to that congregation. 3. A child baptized in another congregation shall be received as a baptized member in the congregation when a transfer has been received. 4. An un-baptized adult who has received instruction and has given evidence of an adequate understanding and acceptance of the teachings of the work of God as confessed by the Lutheran Church, shall upon confession of faith and Baptism, become a baptized member of the congregation. 5. When one or both parents of baptized children are received into the membership of the congregation, such children should be received as baptized members with the consent of the member parent or parents. 6. Where a baptized child is an orphan or ward of someone and these people move into the area served by this congregation, the child may be received as a baptized member when it is commended to the care of this congregation by the congregation which baptized the child. 7. When the parents of a baptized child are not themselves members of the Lutheran Church but move into the area served by this congregation and desire to have their child put within the pastoral care of this congregation, the child may be received as a baptized member.

B. Confirmed Members 1. A baptized adult, not previously a confirmed member of a Lutheran congregation, shall become a confirmed member of this congregation after having received instruction, having given evidence of adequate understanding of the teachings of the Word of God as confessed by the Lutheran Church, and having publicly affirmed their faith. 2. A baptized member of the congregation shall become a confirmed member through the rite of confirmation; except that an adult who has become a baptized member in accordance with the provisions of Section A, (4), of this part of the bylaws shall be considered a confirmed member without participation in the rite of confirmation 3. An applicant for membership who presents a Letter of Transfer which certifies that he is a confirmed member in good standing of a Lutheran congregation shall become a confirmed member of the congregation upon approval by the Church Council. The acceptance of the applicant shall be reported to the congregation. 4. An applicant for membership who presents evidence of confirmation in a Lutheran congregation but does not have a Letter of Transfer shall be admitted to confirmed membership when the Church Council had determined that he meets the standards of Christian faith and life indicated in the constitution and bylaws, and when he has affirmed his faith.

- **C. Voting Members** The Church Council shall determine the roster of voting members of the congregation in accordance with the provisions of the constitution and bylaws. The roster of voting members shall be available at all regularly called meetings of the congregation.
- **D. Associate Members** A person holding membership in other Lutheran congregations but who wish to participate in the life and mission of this congregation as outlined in this congregation's constitution.

E. Discontinuance of Membership 1. The congregation A. In-ground vases, ornaments, figurines, statues, pictures, shall, in the event that a member moves from the community it serves, except those in the Armed Services or those enrolled in an institution of higher learning, encourage the member to request a transfer to a Lutheran congregation which can serve him effectively. Should the member fail to request a transfer, a Lutheran congregation in the community of his residence shall be notified. 2. A confirmed member in good standing desiring to change his membership to another Lutheran congregation shall, upon request, receive a Letter of Transfer. 3. A confirmed member who does not, for a period of one year, partake of Holy Communion, support the church with his offerings, and does not appear to desire to participate in the life and worship of the congregation shall be visited by the pastor and a member of the congregation's council and encouraged by them to active membership. If during the second year, the confirmed member does not actively participate, his name shall be removed from the confirmed membership roster of the congregation, but shall be retained on a responsibility list as one who is in special need of the congregation's prayer and concern. Members outside the community shall be contacted by letter and encouraged to transfer membership to a church in their community. If that has not been accomplished in one year and the member has not fulfilled the previously mentioned criteria the person's name shall be removed from the confirmed membership roster. Extenuating circumstances may be considered on an individual basis by the church council.


In respect of those buried in this cemetery, St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church feels responsible for keeping our cemetery presentable and well maintained into perpetuity. In order to accomplish this at a sustainable cost, all users must abide by the following rules concerning decorations:

- glass or other breakable containers, trellises, shepherd hooks, loose flowers, solar lights, or any commemorative articles of non-degradable materials are not permitted and will be removed and discarded without notice.
- B. All vases shall be attached permanently to the headstone or slab or be of sufficient weight to resist windy All flowers shall be adequately secured in conditions. the previously described vases to keep them from blowing out. Loose flowers on graves will not be permitted.
- C. White solar powered decorations are allowed (one per grave) if they are attached to the headstone or base and not placed in the grass.
- D. Funeral flowers and wreaths placed on fresh graves shall be removed within two weeks of the funeral.
- Flags look impressive on a cemetery, but they fade quickly and usually do not stay upright long if placed directly into the ground. If flags are used, they shall be placed in a small diameter PVC plastic pipe driven into the ground next to the headstone as to not impede mowing. Only one flag per grave is permitted.

The cemetery committee at their discretion shall remove and discard any decorations that they deem inappropriate.
